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DESCRIPTION

This compact, bilaterally symmetrical clapboard house appears to have been derived from a simple one-story cube, with its roof ingeniously designed to exand the attic into liveable space. Basically hipped, the roof has inset gable dormers front and back, and gabled dormers on the sides, providing space for three bedrooms. The double hung windows of the main story are all approximately the same height, and are set in a band. The compact massing, modest size, and full-width front porch are reminiscent of the bungalow style. The centrally placed front door of the house has an oval window surrounded by scrolled carvings. The house has retained all of its original interior woodwork, including round columns flanking the wide archways separating the dining room, living room, and rear parlor, and an open staircase with a craftsman-like balustrade.

ARCHITECTURAL/ENGINEERING SIGNIFICANCE

The Roberts house is one of three farmhouses within the village of Barneveld. The Armeson farm at the western end of Jenniton Road was completely destroyed by the tornado and has been rebuilt with modern buildings. The Murphy farmhouse at 319 N. Grove Street has been altered on the street side. The Roberts house, with its 19 acres of rolling farmland, set at the northernedge of the village, evokes a feeling of the era when a dairy farm within the village limits was not considered offensive. Although the dairy barn has been replaced by a modern shed, the integrity of setting still projects an image of pretornado Barneveld. Virtually unchanged since its construction, this is undoubtedly the most intact 1920s house remaining in Barneveld. It was designed and built by John Lewis, a local builder who had a reputation for excellent craftsmanship.
