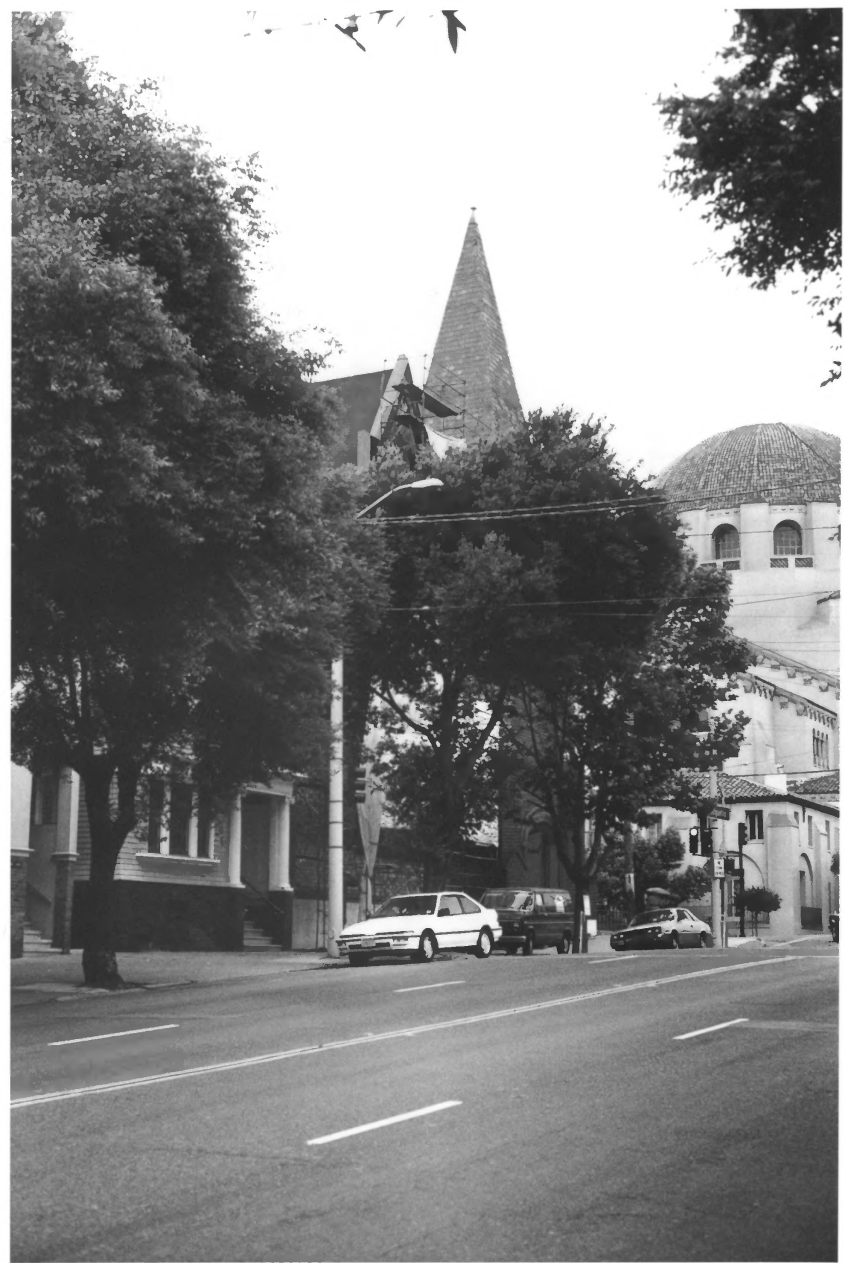

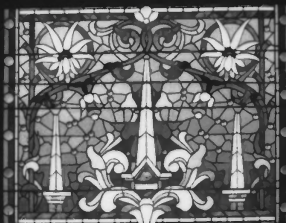
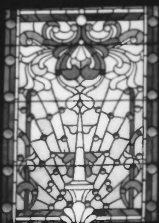

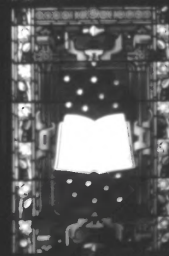
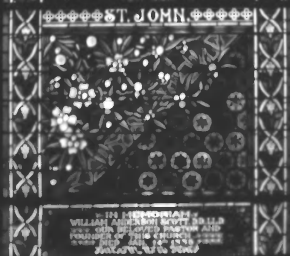
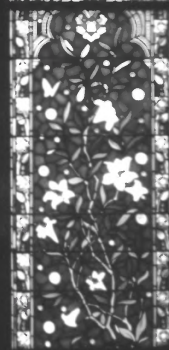
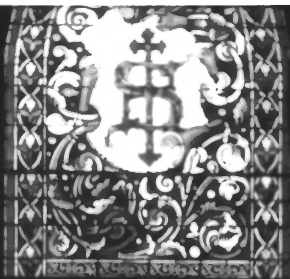

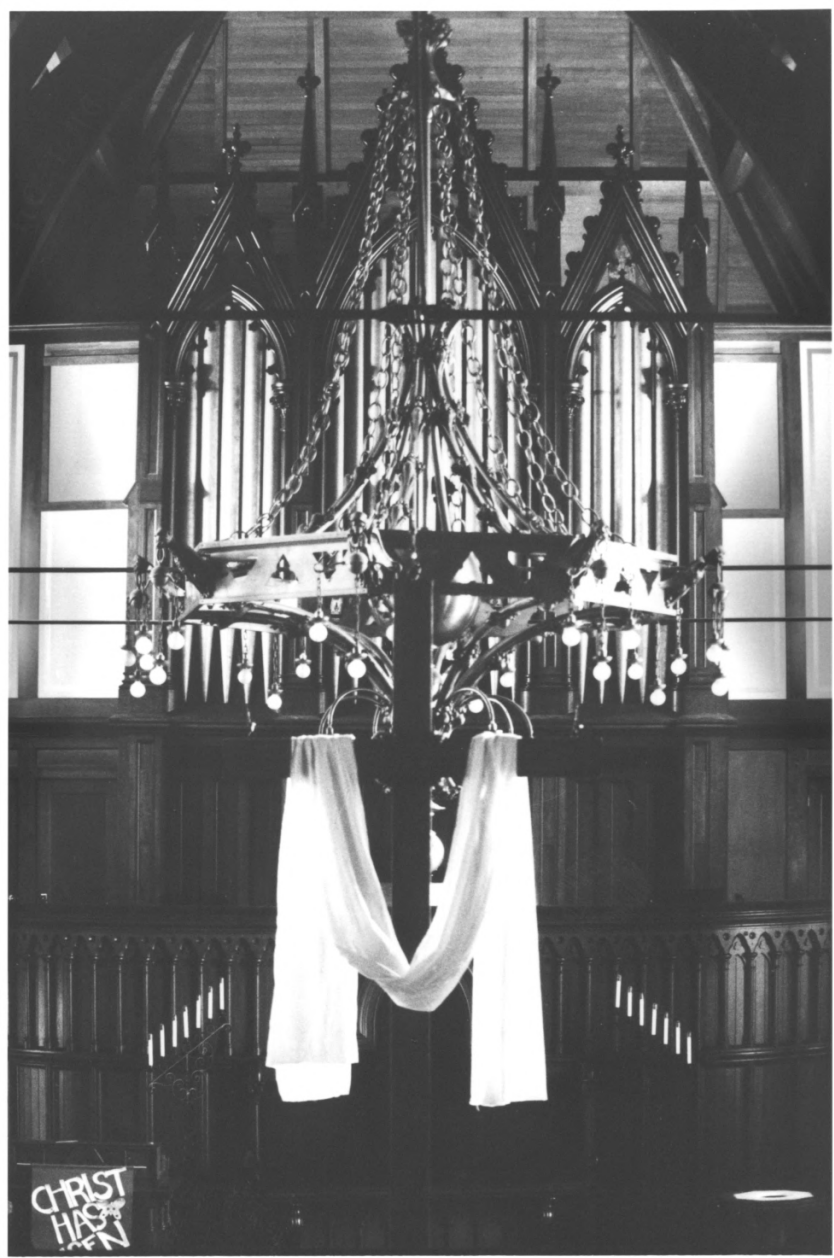

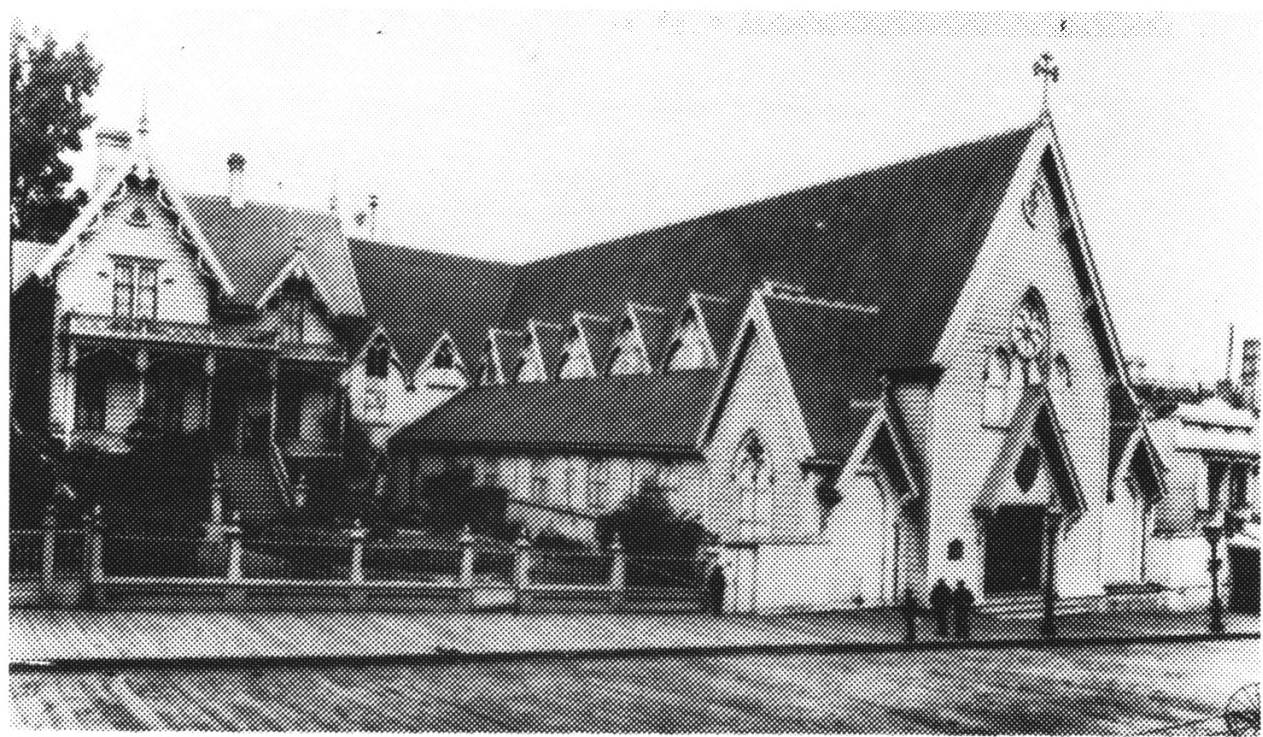

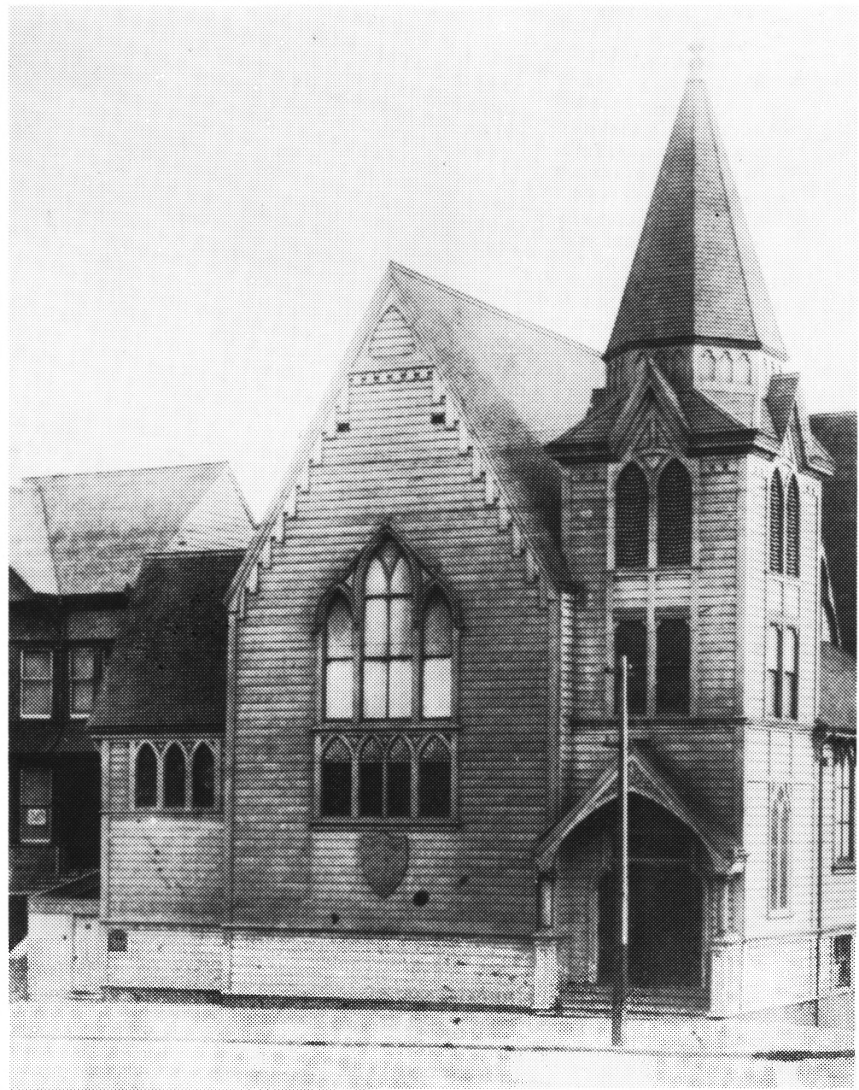


First building at Post and Mason Streets
