The Town type truss, used on the Horton Mill Bridge, was promoted by a New Englander, Ithiel Town, who was granted a patent on the truss. His bridges were built in a lattice style with planks forming a webbing. Only vertical forces were used on the abutments. A genuine American invention, the Town truss made for a durable bridge which could withstand an excessive amount of weight.
