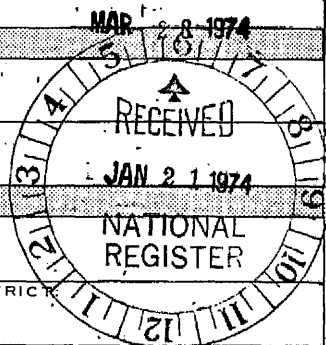

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Rectangular in plan, the Jump River Town Hall is a small, plain, long wooden structure containing a single hall and two small offices. The front (north) and rear (south) facades of the building are trapezoidal with battered ends, and they rise above the roof peak. The roof, included within these end walls, is a simple, long gable. On either side of the building, under the roof's eaves, are bands of double-hung sash windows which run the length of the building.

All exterior vertical surfaces are covered with horizontal board-and-batten siding which has been stained a dark green color. The roof now is covered with green asphalt shingling.

Entry to the building is gained from the front through a small covered porch raised three steps above grade. The porch is covered with a small gable roof projecting from the trapezoidal end wall of the building and resting, originally, on a single, central pier. The central pier rises from a low, rectangular, free-standing wall parallel to the main elevation and including the small porch and its steps. Later additions were the two four-by-four wooden posts which flank the central pier to stabilize the porch roof.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Jump River Town Hall was designed by the major Prairie School architectural firm of (William Gray) Purcell and (George Grant) Elmslie and built in 1915. An exceedingly humble and unpretentious building, it was the first of only two Purcell and Elmslie commissions for small public buildings (the other being the 1917 Municipal Building at Kasson, Minnesota.)¹ Of the two, the Jump River building is, by far, the more modest, barely equalling an ordinary one-room school in its dimensions.

The building receives its architectural significance from having been designed by one of the most important Prairie School firms which practiced in the United States. In spite of its humble proportions, it must be given a statewide level of significance since it is one of only seven buildings by this firm remaining in Wisconsin. Perhaps its greatest significance lies in its historical embodiment of the progressive idea, well-known to Prairie School architects, that serious architectural design innovation can be applied to even the least-grand commissions. Here, the noted talents of Purcell and Elmslie were applied to a building of penultimate diminutiveness — virtually a one-room structure.

Today, the building stands, less normal wear-and-tear, much as it was originally. Next to nothing has been altered, and all that would be needed to put the building back in shape would be some repair and maintenance work. Its relative isolation in a remote and somewhat impecunious area of the state have left it unchanged albeit in need of attention.

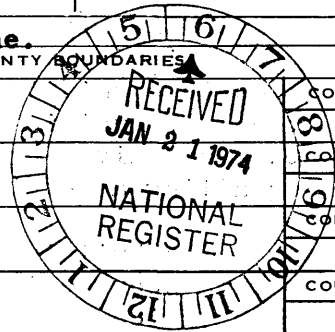
