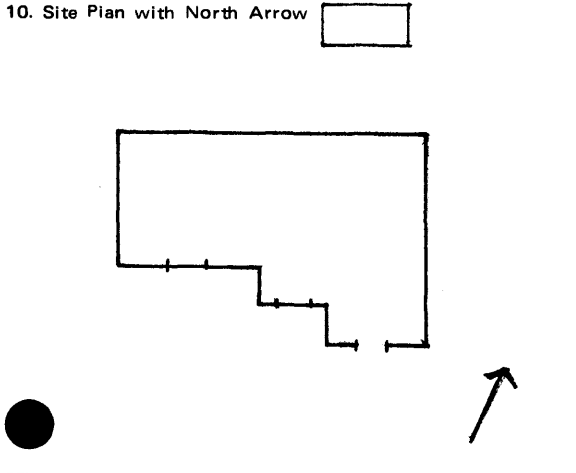

18. Description The Griffith House is a 2 1/2-story, three-bay, L-shaped structure. Paired, scrolled brackets are located under the projecting eaves of the gabled roof sections. A triangle-in-trefoil window pierces the peak of the projecting gable. The central door is treated with a bracketed overdoor. The porch appears to be a later, turn-of-the-century addition. The ruins of an earlier log structure are located to the rear of the main structure. (over)

19. History The structure was built on land acquired by James L. Griffith from his father-in-law Jefferson Graves. Griffith had moved to this Scott County farm in 1873 from Cynthiana, Ky., where he had engaged in the legal profession.

20. Significance The structure is a clear illustration of the rural Italianate style found in Scott County.

18. The nominated acreage includes the main structure, the remains of the log house and sufficient land to retain the setting.

Verbal Boundary Description

The boundary begins at point A (see U. S. G. S. map) on the north side of Moore's Mill Pike and runs northwest for approximately 700 feet to point B, turns southeast for approximately 300 feet to point C and then runs for approximately 175 feet to point D. The line then follows the private drive for approximately 700 feet to point E where it meets Moore's Mill Pike, and follows the north side of the pike for approximately 275 feet to the point of origin.
