The dining room contains a fireplace which appears to be original both masonry and woodwork. There is also an original doorframe and door between this room and the kitchen - the only original inside door surviving in the house. The second floor chamber over the parlor contains a fireplace whose woodwork and masonry are probably original. As with the room below this is flanked by two closets. The room behind this also contains an intact original fireplace mantel. Flooring in these two rooms is original. The trim and woodwork on the rest of the floor are apparently not original fabric. A The building underwent extensive "restoration" by the W.P.A. in 19345at which time the alterations noted, as well as major changes in cornice design, occured. A number of other changes not all yet determined - were also made then." The original twelve pane windows on the first and second floors were altered to ones containing Alights sometime early in this century. A porch was added to the front of the building in 1915 and removed recently - the current pedimented doorway dating from the removal of the porch.
