DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Appleton City Hall is a two story Richardsonian styled building. Characteristics of this style include the three story corner tower containing the building's main entrance, arched entryways, gables capped with stone coping, and stone lintels and sills.

The foundation of the building is constructed of granite and concrete. The structural system consists of red brick bearing walls and heavy timber trusses supporting the hipped roof. Other than filling in openings and arches the exterior of the building has not been altered since its construction.

The first floor of the building originally consisted of three sections housing three functions of city government -- the fire hall, city jail and city administrative office space. In recent years the first floor housed a community meeting room, a library, offices and the city jail. Alterations to the first floor include flooring tile over the original wood floor and flourescent lighting suspended from the ceiling. The second floor houses an auditorium. Significant features in the auditorium are an impressive domed ceiling, original wood floors, and a 1920's roll down, hand painted stage curtain featuring a rural scene and advertisements of local merchants.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

1895 - present

The Appleton City Hall is significant as an example of the Richardsonian style of architecture and as the governmental and community center for the town from 1895 to the present.

The building stands as one of the few 19th century monumental buildings in the rural area of western Minnesota. The building functioned as a social center for the community as well as a center for city business activities. The theater on the second floor of the building was used for Lyceums and touring theater groups in the first half of the century.

The Appleton City Hall will be totally vacated in November of 1976. Cultural Affairs Committee and community citizens are currently planning to provide space within the building for the Appleton Art Club, Community Theater, Photo Club, and the Senior Citizens Club.
