

7. Description

The Luna Lodge consists of two one-story buildings and a third building with a two-story portion. The second floor serves as the manager's residence and is located over the office at the southwest corner of the property. The buildings have flat roofs, white stucco walls, and concrete foundations, and details reflect a modest use of the Southwest Vernacular Style. The elements as well as the spatial arrangement of the property, including the cafe, and the relatively unaltered appearance of the buildings imbue the property with a strong feeling of an early 1950s tourist court.

Southwest Vernacular Style details include a parapet, flared stucco hoods over doors and slightly articulated stucco sills. The windows are metal casement, and most doors are wood panel with no lights. The front portion of the office has a roof with a wide overhang mirroring its curved walls. Large, multi-light metal casement windows wrap around the office, flanking its wood frame door. The second-story residential portion has an infill at the front in which a room with a large picture window replaced an earlier porch. A cafe located at the southeast corner, and several feet wider than the line of living units adjoining it, also has metal casement windows. The motel's neon consists of straight and zig-zag patterns outlining the parapets of the buildings and the second-story walls of the residence and a "coffee shop" sign above the cafe.

The property is organized in a broken U-plan with twenty-eight units divided among the three discreet portions of the motel, forming a long interior courtyard that faces Central Avenue. A small concrete median in the middle of the courtyard determines traffic flow. Flanking the entry to the courtyard and set back about twenty-five feet from the sidewalk are the office and a cafe. A metal pole located at the sidewalk supports several signs for the motel and cafe. In addition to the infill of the second-story porch, other changes include the infill of

some garages located only on the west wing and a replacement of some of the motel's original signs. These changes, however, do not detract from the historic feeling of the property.

8. Statement of Significance

The Luna Lodge is one of the best examples of a largely unaltered tourist court remaining along Route 66 in New Mexico. The motel was built in 1949 and at the time was one of the easternmost motels along the East Central Avenue commercial strip. Because of this close association with the golden era of tourism along Route 66, the property is eligible under Criterion The property also qualifies under Criterion C for the way in which its setting, location, design and materials reflect early tourist court construction in New Mexico. In particular, the spatial arrangement of the complex with its long U-plan punctuated by the office/residence and cafe at either end enhances the significance of the property, recalling how the combination of food and lodging offered at campgrounds in the early decades of automobile tourism persisted in the postwar years. Criterion Consideration G also applies to the property in that it is of exceptional importance within its property type. It reflects the continuation of the same building patterns for tourist courts, as discussed in the Multiple Property listing, that appeared prior to World War II and then through the period of significance.
