18. Description Log dog trot house. Five-bay v-notched; exterior stone chimneys have collapsed. Most significant features are the Greek details: Greek keys at the tops of fluted pilasters. Guttae used for dentils. Greeks keys on stairway (open string). Pilasters and piers at the doorway.

20. Significance Apparently built by Milton Holiday, this was originally a log dogtrot structure. The house was sheathed by an early owner who had an exuberant and provincial knowledge of the Greek Revival style. Whimsical details include oversized moldings, Greek keys on the corner pilasters, and a series of guttae on the cornice rather than the more standard use of dentils.
