Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Abreu Residence is a two-storey, masonry and wood, commercial and residential building on the south sise of Calle Gonzalo Marín, at Number 61, in the historic center of Arecibo. The base level is of stuccoed load-bearing masonry and the main, upped floor is of timber and clapboard construction. The composition consists of four bays, spaced evenly and symmetrically at both the ground and upper storeys.

At the commercial base level, two central rectangular entrance bays are flanked by smaller, square window openings. Each opening is articulated by heavy, planar, masonry surrounds. Bay number 2 contains original, wooden, double-doors with glass transoms, but bay number 3 has been altered to house aluminum and glass commercial doors.

A planar pilaster strip frames the east and west extremes of the ground-floor. A continous base mould and a simple cornice delineate the lower and upper limits of the masonry base-storey, respectively.

The wooden, residential main storey repeats the rythm of the ground floor, save that all openings are identical: narrow and rectangular, framed by planar surrounds and containing wooden, double-door jalousies with stained glass lights. These doors open out onto a spacious balcony that spans the full width of the structure. At the balcony, wooden colonnettes, spanned by a wooden-baluster railing, support a timber and sheet-metal hipped roof that shelters the balcony and the main house structure.

Although there is no documentation as to the original appereance of the house, it can be assumed from the prototype that the facade remains true to the original form and that an original, ceramics tile roof was replaced by metallic sheets during the early twentieth century. Traces of the ceramic tile are visible from the interior, above the timber construction.

In all, the Abreu residence maintains most of the original elements and character of its prototype. Its age and priviledged location qualify it as one of Arecibo's most valuable structures.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

Although an exact date of construction cannot be determined, based on historic photographs of the area, we can say that the structure alrealdy existed on this lot by 1860. Judging from the rustic characteristics of the ruble construction of the ground floor, the thickness of its walls, and the location of the building near the towb plaza, it is probable that the ground-floor was built during the 18th Century in the simple. functional manner typical of early Spanish houses. The interior floor level, lower than the street, is proof of the house's advancec age, and raises the possibility of the houses's existence's prior to the XVIII century. The 19th Century, wooden, upper level addition is nonetheless significant in itself, since it dates prior to 1860 and survived both the hurricane of San Ciriaco in 1899 and the building boom of the late 19th and early 20th century commerce with the United States, which facilitated the acquisitions and use of light-weight, pre-fabricated metal roofing materials. Thus, the Abreu Residence is one of a handful of remaining "folk" dwellins, and one of the oldest in the area of the Plaza of Arecibo.
