

#### Description and House Plan:

The Morgan House is composed of a stone room and a brick unit joined by a frame breezeway. The stone building on the south end of the complex is a one-and-one-half &cories high. The original front facade faced southwest. It was three bays with a door flanked on either side by a window. An exterior stone end chimney is located on the south gable end of the rectangular structure. The window surrounds appear to be intact, but the glazing has been changed to two over two. The interior has been modified, but the large fireplace opening is still visible. The brick portion of the house is one-and-one-half stories. principal facade faces northeast and is five bays. The central doorway is double leaf, eight-panelled, with a six-light transom. The windows are 16 over 12. The brick in the front facade is laid in Flemish bond. The central hallway is flanked by two rooms on either side. rooms in the front half of the house are larger than those on the rear. Interior mantels contain sunbursts, reeding and detailing of Federal period. The front room on the north side of the hall was remodeled in the mid-nineteenth century to add Greek Revival features of wide baseboards and heavier woodwork around doors. A kitchen wing was added to the rear or southwest side of the brick house around 1914. A porch on the kitchen

addition has been enclosed. To the south of the stone portion of the house stands a two-room wooden outbuilding with a central stone chimney. The threegabled dormers on the front of the house are probably not original nor is a large central gabled dormer to the rear which dates from the era of the brick kitchen addition. A stone foundation supports the brick structure.



#### Significance Statement

The Joseph Morgan House is significant under Criterion C for the theme of architecture in the period from 1790 to 1820 as an example of a double-pile, central passage house ornamented with elements of the Federal style including Flemish bond brickwork, reeding on the window surrounds, and sunbursts on the mantels. The property may be eligible under Criterion B once additional research in the county's commercial context is completed.

#### Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary was chosen arbitrarily to provide a setting for the house and to incorporate all of the outbuildings which contribute to the significance of the property.

The boundary contains two contributing buildings.

### 14. History

The Morgan House, or Round Ridge, was the home of Joseph Morgan, one of the county's outstanding early nineteenth century businessmen. Morgan (1772-1860) was married in 1798 to Ann Bryan in Lincoln County. Ann was the daughter of William and Elizabeth Bryan. Elizabeth, the daughter of ann and Joseph Morgan, married John G. Chiles in 1823. Chiles kept the tavern in Morgan Row in Harrodsburg. Joseph Morgan financed and built the four brick units of Morgan Row which contained lodging rooms in addition to the tavern during the period from 1807 to 1830.
