DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The William A. Mackay house at 304 N.E. 4th Street is Madison's most impressive older home. It is a large $2\frac{1}{2}$ story frame house with a cut stone foundation and an asphalt shingled roof. A pedimented portico is supported by giant fluted Corinthian columns. Balustrades appear on the ground floor porch and above it. The porch covers the front (south) facade of the Neo-Classical Revival style home and curves around to partially cover the west wall. Modillions decorate the cornices and pediments. A semi-elliptical window lights the large pediment covering part of the front porch. Fluted Corinthian pilasters are seen on the corners of the house. Fenestration varies from stained glass windows on the front facade to semi-elliptical and rectangular windows. A porte-cochere extends from the east wall.

The house is a single family residence in excellent condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Mackay house is the most oustanding example of Neo-Classical Revival style architecture in Madison, South Dakota. Many local people consider the Mackay home Madison's most beautiful dwelling. In 1886 Alvin B. Olmorr built a small house on the SW¼ of block one in Kennedy's Extension. William Alexander Mackay bought the property in 1889 and contracted with Ed and Bert Reeves, early local builders, to construct the Neo-Classical Revival style home around the original Olmorr building. The Lake County Assessor lists the completion date as 1893. The Mackay family occupied the house until 1915, when Joseph Henkin purchased it.

Mackay was a railraod mail dispatcher in Illinois until 1885, when he came to South Dakota and associated with the First National Bank. Later he organized the Daly Mackay Bank and the Mackay Brothers Bank.

Henkin, a later owner, was also a prominent citizen. He established a television and radio station in Sioux Falls. Henkins occupied the house from 1915 to 1928.

Dakota State College used the Mackay house for a men's dormitory dubbed "The Hermitage," in the late 1920's.

Over the years, the house has been associated with families who promoted the development of their college, town, and state.
