DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Holmdel Community Church of the United Church of Christ owns the old Dutch Reformed Church property situated on the northeast corner of Main Street and Holmdel-Keyport Road in the Township of Holmdel, New Jersey. In addition to the church edifice, a chapel is also located on the premises. Both buildings are of frame construction and are located on their original sites.

The original section of the church was built shortly after the property was purchased in 1837. It was forty-two feet wide and sixty-two feet long. Originally sixty-two pews were installed.

In 1855 a steeple was added and a new bell was installed.

A major alteration was made in 1897 when a twelve foot addition was constructed on the rear of the church building. At the same time, the original structure was renovated by installing a tin ceiling and a slate roof. In addition, the interior was further improved by replacing the original pews and by laying Brussels carpet in the chancel area. The stained glass windows were also installed at this time.

The exterior of the church edifice is Greek Revival in form. The steeple is graceful and well proportioned and harmonizes with the main structure. Some Italianate detailing is present. The fine stained glass windows add much to the appearance of this beautiful building. A stained glass eyebrow window in the front gable and round stained glass memorial windows, two on each side of the building, complement the tall stained glass memorial windows. The exterior of the church is in good condition.

The interior of the building retains much of its 1897 appearance. The most evident alteration from that time is the decorative tin ceiling.

The chapel was built in 1850. It is 1 1/2 stories and Greek Revival in style.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Dutch Reformed Church, from which the present 1838 building descends, is the oldest church of its denomination in central New Jersey, as well as one of the oldest in the state.

Architecturally, the church represents a Greek Revival form with Greek Revival detailing around the entrance doors. The steeple has Italianate detailing on a traditional steeple form. The interior of the church reflects the popularized use of pressed tin, a late 19th century alteration to the church.

The church is located at the crossroads of Holmdel Village and is the only structure of historic significance remaining at this focal point of Holmdel.
