DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

St. James Church is located on the east side of Maryland Route 2, just north of the intersection of Maryland Route 2 and Maryland Route 258.

St. James, Lothian, is a nearly square, rectangular building of all-header brick. Above the simple wood box-cornice is a hip roof with a very slight bell-cast to it. There is a simple water table of projecting brick at the level of the side window sills. There are four round-top windows on each side of the nave, six of which are filled with stained glass (later memorials). Stained glass also fills the two round-top windows in the east wall. On the south side, there is an open archway porch with a similar bell-cast roof which was added in 1939. To the rear (southeast), there is a recent brick addition. Adjacent to this is an open arched bell tower post. The south and west entrance doors are divided vertically and are topped by flat elliptical fanlights with radiating muntins.

The interior has a coved ceiling, box pews, a "Gothick" altar rail, and Decalogue tablets from the early eighteenth century. Except for an occasional memorial tablet, the walls are plain.

There is a recent, Colonial Revival parish house to the east of the church.

Built on the site of two earlier churches, St. James, Lothian, was begun in 1763 by a parish which had occupied this site since its establishment as one of thirty Anglican parishes laid out in 1692. It is not unlike contemporaneous Episcopal churches in Virginia, such as Pohick Church or Christ Church, Alexandria, with the hip roof and simple rectangular plan. In its large, round-headed windows, two with fifteen over fifteen sashes and clear panes, it shows some stylistic sophistication as opposed to the severe Anglican churches of Southern Maryland, e.g., St. George's, Valley Lee, 1799. St. James reflects the influence of James Gibbs on American church architecture of that time. These are the same kind of windows employed by Peter Harrison in King's Chapel, Boston, 1749, and at Christ Church, Cambridge, 1763. Stylistically, St. James could have taken on a spire similar to the one added to Christ Church in Alexandria (early nineteenth century).

The church is surrounded by a burial ground. It contains some seventeenth century graves, notably those of Christopher Birkhead and his wife, her stone of 1665 "being the oldest known in Maryland."

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

St. James Church stands on the site of two earlier churches which occupied the identical location of the first church building, erected at the time of the establishment of the original thirty Anglican parishes. The present (1972) structure dates from 1763. It replaced a 1698 church building that had replaced the first St. James Church, built before 1692.

One of the oldest known tombstones in the State of Maryland (1665) is located in the St. James Church cemetery. The grave of Ann Birkhead, it probably pre-dates the erection of the first church.

Mason Locke Weems (1759-1825), the biographer of George Washington, was born in St. James Parish, Maryland, and educated for the priesthood in London, England. He was the first minister to serve St. James Church who did not take an oath of allegiance to England at his ordination (1784). Weems served several other Episcopal churches before he abandoned the profession in 1794 to become a book salesman and author. He is best known for his Life and Memorable Actions of George Washington, which remains one of the major early nineteenth century biographies of Washington. The story of young George chopping down the cherry tree and subsequently becoming the epitome of truth, first appeared in the fifth edition of Weems' biography.

Thomas John Claggett (1793-1816), a contemporary of Mason Locke Weems, was also a rector of St. James Church. Educated in Calvert County, Maryland, and at the College of New Jersey (Princeton University), Claggett was ordained by the Bishop of London in 1767. He became the first Bishop of Maryland in 1792.

Another rector of St. James Parish was Henry Hall (1676-1722), who came to the parish in 1698. He is remembered as a colorful figure. When a group of Anne Arundel County Quakers refused to pay the required tithes to the Church of England for the support of the rector of St. James, Hall rode to the Galesville Friends' Meeting and threatened to horsewhip the Quakers if they did not pay immediately. Hall's body is buried in the chancel of St. James Church.

8. SIGNIFICANCE, continued

The tablets on St. James' altar, bearing the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments, were given by Mrs. William Locke in 1723. Locke, himself, gave a silver baptismal basin dated 1732. The silver alms basin was donated by the widow of the Reverend Henry Hall in 1724. England's Queen Anne gave the church bell in 1706.

St. James continues as a flourishing parish in 1972. All the records are intact from 1692, except for the Parish Register from 1855 to 1890, which was burned in the rectory fire of 1900. The forty-acre glebe, willed to the parish in 1700 by Mr. and Mrs. James Rigbie, is under active cultivation. A recently initiated project is an eighteenth-century herb garden.
