State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Dr. York W. Bailey House is significant as an intact and good example of the vernacular American Foursqure house form, popular in the early twentieth century. It is also significant for its association with Dr. York W. Bailey, a prominent native of the island who was St. Helena's first black doctor and only resident physician for over fifty years. The house was built c. 1915 for Bailey. He ordered it from a mail-order catalog and it was shipped to Beaufort, then brought across to the island by boat and assembled. He lived in this house until his death in 1971. Rossa Cooley, principal of Penn School, described the house in 1926 as "an achievement and an inspiration to any Penn School It stands back from the road, with a neat wire fence around it, a boy. lawn planted, an orchard in the rear, a concrete walk to the steps. It is a two-story house and the windmill nearby tells the story - running water and a bathtub. The furnishings inside are as attractive and in as good taste as could be desired - a real home."(1) Bailey, born on St. Helena in 1881, graduated from Penn School and Hampton Institute and studied medicine at Howard University, returning to the island in During his tenure as the island's only resident doctor he was 1906. often paid in trade with livestock or produce, which he sold in Beaufort. His career was frequently cited as an example of the success of Penn School in educating the blacks of St. Helena, and the York W. Bailey Cultural Center and Museum at Penn Community Center is named for him.(2)
