


Description

Located in the southern reaches of Arkansas's Ozark Mountain region, the Gray Spring Recreation Area/Forest Service Road #1003 Historic District (Ozark-St. Francis National Forest) is composed of a CCC-constructed picnic area and the associated CCC-constructed Forest Service road that connects the picnic area with State Highway 23 to the east and other Forest Service roads and recreational areas to the west. The picnic area is located on the western side of Forest Service Road #1003 (which clings to the southern shoulders of Black Mountain) on the crest of a gradual decline that was chosen for its beautiful views across Deep Hollow of the mountains to the west and south. It was designed to provide a pleasant and scenic stop for motorists and hikers visiting the mountains. The contributing resources within the picnic area include a gable roof, wood log and stone picnic shelter (FR0073), a stone sign support (FR0073A), an outdoor barbecue pit (FR0073B), two signage rocks with carved directional script (FR0075A and FR0078A), a stone and concrete picnic table (FR0076) and a male and female toilet facility (FR0078). The non-contributing structures are limited to the three substantially-rebuilt picnic tables (the original square stone bases have been removed and new concrete tables and benches installed; FR0074, FR0075 and FR0077). The included section of the associated Forest Service road (approximately 4.7 miles in length) contains one stone and concrete bridge (FR0122) and sixty-two stone culverts (FR0079-0121 and FR0123-0141), all of which were also constructed by the CCC. As such, the district contains a total of 73 resources, 70 of which are contributing and 3 non-contributing.

The contributing resources in the picnic area are all of original CCC stone construction. The shelter is constructed of four battered stone columns that are connected by a solid stone balustrade and that support a wood log and wood shingle gable roof. A single opening in the eastern wall allows access into the shelter, the interior of which is unornamented with the exception of the built-in wooden benches at the southern and northern ends. The male and female toilet facility is designed around an ell-shaped plan, with the female facility at the northern end and male facility opposite. A large stone chimney placed within the ell intersection originally allowed for the burning of the waste materials; however, this is no longer in use as the original toilets have been replaced with the chemical variety. One of the carved directional stones is placed just to the north of the toilet facility.

The contributing resources along the associated Forest Service road (there are no non-contributing resources on the included section of this road) consist of sixty-two fieldstone culverts and one coursed fieldstone and concrete bridge running over Spirits Creek. Most of the stone culverts consist of simple, random-laid fieldstone facings at either end of a concrete (or metal) conduit that are no more than 2-4 feet in total height and 4-6 feet in length. some culvert facings are constructed of rough-cut, coursed stone surrounding the culvert opening, some feature flared exterior flanking walls, some feature "duck nests" (small, stone-lined receptacles for collecting runoff water and diverting it through a culvert to a lower elevation on the opposite side of the road), and some were even augmented with a sequence of dry-laid fieldstones extending from the front of the downhill side to provide a clear channel draining the water away from the road. Though none are terribly elaborate and some are clearly in a better state of preservation than others, all were constructed by the CCC during the construction of this road. The single bridge, by contrast, is anchored by a central concrete culvert that is flanked by two coursed, cut-stone approach walls that support the concrete deck above.

The seventy contributing resources that comprise the Gray Spring Recreation Area/Forest Service Road #1003 Historic District (Ozark-St. Francis National Forest) were constructed in 1934-35 by the enrollees of the 748th Company of the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), Arkansas District, working out of their camp at Cass, Arkansas (located approximately five miles to the east of this district). The Cass camp -- established for the purpose of providing manpower for projects within the central ranger districts of what was then the Ozark National Forest -- was a typical CCC camp in that it sheltered approximately 200 enrollees who worked out of the Cass camp itself and at least three known side camps (side camps were composed of small units of enrollees who were assigned to a temporary campsite away from the main camp for the purpose of completing a specific project located too far from the main camp for a daily commute). Forest Service Road #1003 had previously been nothing more than a rough trail through this section of the Ozark Mountains connecting the communities of Cass to the east and Bidville to the north and west that was impassable for vehicular traffic. The improvement of this trail into a planned, graded vehicular roadway intended for use year-round -- complete with the necessary drainage culverts and a bridge, as well as its associated picnic area -- was one of the earliest recorded projects undertaken by the enrollees from this CCC camp.

As both a road improvement and recreation facility constructed by the CCC it represents a property type associated with the historic context *Facilities Constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps in Arkansas, 1933-1942*. These resources were constructed within this remote, forested area for the purpose of providing both vehicular access to heretofore inaccessible sections of the forest and developed recreational facilities for the purpose of encouraging tourism. As such, the Gray Spring Recreation Area/Forest Service Road #1003 Historic District remains locally significant under Criterion A through its associations with the contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps and its associations with the emphasis upon conservation and enjoyment of our natural resources that was the original mandate of the CCC. It is also significant under Criterion C, firstly by virtue of Forest Road #1003's status as a good and intact example of an original CCC rural road building project that, because of its location on the slope of a mountain, incorporated a variety of drainage structures in its construction, and secondly by virtue of the associated picnic area's buildings and structures being representative examples of the Rustic style of architecture favored by the CCC throughout the state.

miles to its intersection with the eastern edge of Forest Service Road #1510; thence proceed northerly along a line running perpendicular to the edge of Forest Service Road #1003 for a distance of approximately 100 feet to its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel with the Forest Service Road #1003's northern edge; thence proceed easterly along said line for a distance of approximately 4.7 miles to a point located directly opposite the intersection of the western edge of Forest Service Road #1512 with the southern edge of Forest Service Road #1003; thence proceed southerly along a perpendicular line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to the point of beginning.






Dear Keeper;
