Describe present and historic physical appearance.

Saint Matthew's Roman Catholic Church rests on the southwest corner of Marine and Garrity Streets in the south Mobile neighborhood of Oakdale. Indeed, an entire block is taken up by the church, church school, parish hall, rectory and parking. Only the church itself is historic and it of course dominantes the block. It is a 3x8 bay, brick, $1\frac{1}{2}$ story gable to the front Mediterranean Revival structure. The building's form includes a central l_2^1 story block with flanking one story wings. There is a concrete water table scored to simulate ashlar. The facade is dominated by a monumental inset arched opening with three sets of double wooden doors, a pair of one story fluted Ionic columns with full entablature which continues all around the building except for the rear and large stained glass lunette divided into three sections by two square pillars above the entablature. The entablature includes a decorative freize band, dental blocks and egg There is an escutcheon either side of the lunette. and dart molding. The gable roof features exposed rafters and a red tile roof, with a small white cross on top. Round top stained glass windows are to either side in the one story wings and there are finial urns up top here. The side elevations feature round top stained glass windows in arched brick panels, creating an arcaded rhythm along the sides. There is one exterior brick chimney at the north rear.

At the south rear elevation is a four story square bell tower with a hip roof. The first section is delineated by the freize band and includes paired rectangular windows in each face. The second section is delineated by narrow white belt courses and includes paired rectangular windows as well. The third section is plain brick while the fourth features a Palladian opening in each face with a brakceted balcony, all in white stone. The bell may be seen within and a cross is on top of the hip roof.

Saint Matthew's Church is entered through a vestibule and three pairs of double wooden doors with windows. The interior plan consists of a nave with two rows of pews and side aisles with pews. The aisles are delineated by Corinthian columns with full entablature (decortive frieze band, egg and dart molding). There is a clerestory over the nave with round top stained glass windows and a stenciled pattern of brown rectangular blocks with white and green bands runnig across the garreted ceiling at each bay and two bands run the length of the ceiling. Stained glass windows are along the length of each aisle, interspersed by sculptures of the garreted continuation sheet

stations of the cross. There is a balcony above the entrance which features an arcaded Corinthian balustrade. The large stained glass lunette dominates. The chancery rail is the same as that of the balcony. The altar stands in the apse and there is a niche on each side. The apse ceiling features a painting of Christ on the cross and vine-like patterns.

Integrity

Saint Matthew's Catholic Church retains its integrity of location, design and materials. The only exterior changes of note are the concrete Art Deco cheeks on either side of the entrance steps added in 1941. Interior alterations are limited to the tile floor and sanctuary decorations which also date from 1941.
