A deed written in 1774 indicates Isaac Littlefield obtained land from Jeremiah Wheelwright. Isaac's son Joseph received property with buildings in 1799, so feel home built sometime in between.

Originally a half cape with only one window on either side of front door - interior shows where additional window added on south side. Two small fireplaces in each front room. Back room has a beehive bake oven with metal door and box like area where water was heated. No fire-place exists in this area.
