DESCRIPTION	<p>ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION AND PRESENT CONDITION: Greek Revival; square plan, one story tall, cinderblock foundation, hip roof with hip roof central portico; mortise and tenon construction with weatherboard siding, one interior chimney on east side of house, asphalt shingle roof; front facade details include double-door central entryway, each door with a transom, doors surrounded by flush tongue and groove sheathing which is protected by porch with two square columns, to either side of the doors is a 2/2 double hung sash window, frieze and cornice runs on all four sides of house; interior of house has four rooms, additions to rear c. 1959 when house was moved; landscaping (CONT'D)</p>

AREA(S) OF SIGNIFICANCE: Local History, Architecture LEVEL: Local</p> <p>STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL): <u>Local History</u>: Although moved from its original site on the square, this home nonetheless continues to be significant as the office of Dr. Miller, a leading physician, in the late 1800's. It is today more closely associated by local citizens as the telephone exchange. It served in that capacity from 1909 to 1958. <u>Architecture</u>: Significant in that it is a fine example of Greek Revival cottage architecture, this house has simple, yet dignified proportioning. Its historic architectural integrity was not compromised when the house was moved.</p>
