7 DESCRIPTION

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DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Gust Akerlund Photography Studio is located on a corner lot at 390 Broadway Avenue in Cokato. It is a simple, single storey, wood frame building which combines photography studio and owner's residence. It remains relatively unaltered (with the exception of re-siding of the south facade with asphalt composition singles and the residence portion with stucco) since its construction in 1903.Original narrow-lap clapboard exists beneath. The narrow-lap clapboard has been retained unsheathed on the north and east (principal) facades. A narrow, open porch with turned columns extends the length of the east facade; this porch is the only decorative element employed on the exterior.

The interior arrangement comprises the photography studio (office, dressing room, posing room and darkroom) in the Broadway Avenue section with the photographer's residence placed to the rear adjacent to the alley. The posing room is most noteworthy, with a one-and-one-half storey skylight of translucent glass on the north wall. The ceiling in this room is of pressed metal in geometric patterns. The entire west wall is devoted to a painted canvas scene which serves as a backdrop for the subject during a photo session.

Many of the original (1903) furnishings such as photographer's chairs, occasional tables, desk and cabinets remain in the building. Akerlund's large wooden-case portrait camera also remains.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

8 SIGNIFICANCE

The Akerlund Photographic Studio is one of the rare, extant examples of an early 20th century photographic studio which has been serving the community of Cokato, Minnesota for more than 70 years.

The Akerlund Studio was built on the corner lot on Fourth and Broadway in Cokato, Minnesota in 1903. August Bernard Akerlund, born in Sweden arrived in the United States in his 20s, first living in Wisconsin. After learning the photographic trade in Ironwood, Michigan, he arrived in Cokato in 1902 and established his studio. Night classes in chemistry taken from the University of Minnesota allowed Akerlund to develop his own high quality prints. Drawing his customers from a tri-county area, photographs of weddings, anniversaries and confirmations remain today bearing the imprint, "Photo by Akerlund". His studio is still run by a photographer who uses Akerlunds's "posing" chairs, canvas backdrops, skylight and workroom equipment.
