The Saunders-Boyd House is a two-story frame, four bay, asymmetrical plan, Queen Anne influenced residence built ca. 1900. The house has a brick foundation, gable roof of asphalt shingles, interior brick chimneys, and weatherboard siding. On the main (south) facade is a onestory shed, elliptical porch with Doric columns. The central bay of the house is elliptical and projects from the main block. This bay projects above the roofline and has a conical tower and finial.

On the main facade are two primary entrances each of which have original frame and glass single light doors. Windows are original one-over-one rectangular wood sash. The exterior surface of the central tower has fish scale wood shingles.

The interior retains its original floor plan and much of its original woodwork. This includes Queen Anne influenced mantles, a milled newel post and staircase, and decorative door moldings.

The house is located on a rectangular urban lot in a residential area of Hodgenville. At the rear of the house is a ca. 1950 frame garage which is included as a non-contributing building, and a ca. 1900 vertical board shed which is a contributing building. At the sidewalk level is a rusticated hollow core concrete block retaining wall which was added soon after the house's construction and is included as a contributing structure. PROPERTY TYPE: Urban Residential Architecture

The Saunders-Boyd House is significant under criterion C as a fine example of the Queen Anne style. The house is one of four high style Queen Anne houses which were identified in Larue County which retain their original design and detailing. The design of the residence features a large central elliptical bay and is the only Queen Anne residence identified in the county with this design. The house has not been significantly altered and retains its original site and setting.

The residence was built ca. 1900 by Mr. and Mrs. T.E. Saunders. Mr. Saunders was a businessman while Mrs. Saunders was an eye doctor with offices in the residence. The Saunders family owned the house until 1909 when it was sold to Dr. and Mrs. A.T. Boyd. Dr. Boyd was a dentist who practiced in Hodgenville and his wife, Ella Boyd, was active in local activities such as the Ladies' Lincoln League. The house was handed down in the family and is presently occupied by descendants. No major changes or additions to the house have been made since its construction. NPS Form 10-900-a (8-86)




Verbal Boundary Justification: The boundary for the Saunders-Boyd House includes all property historically associated with the house.
