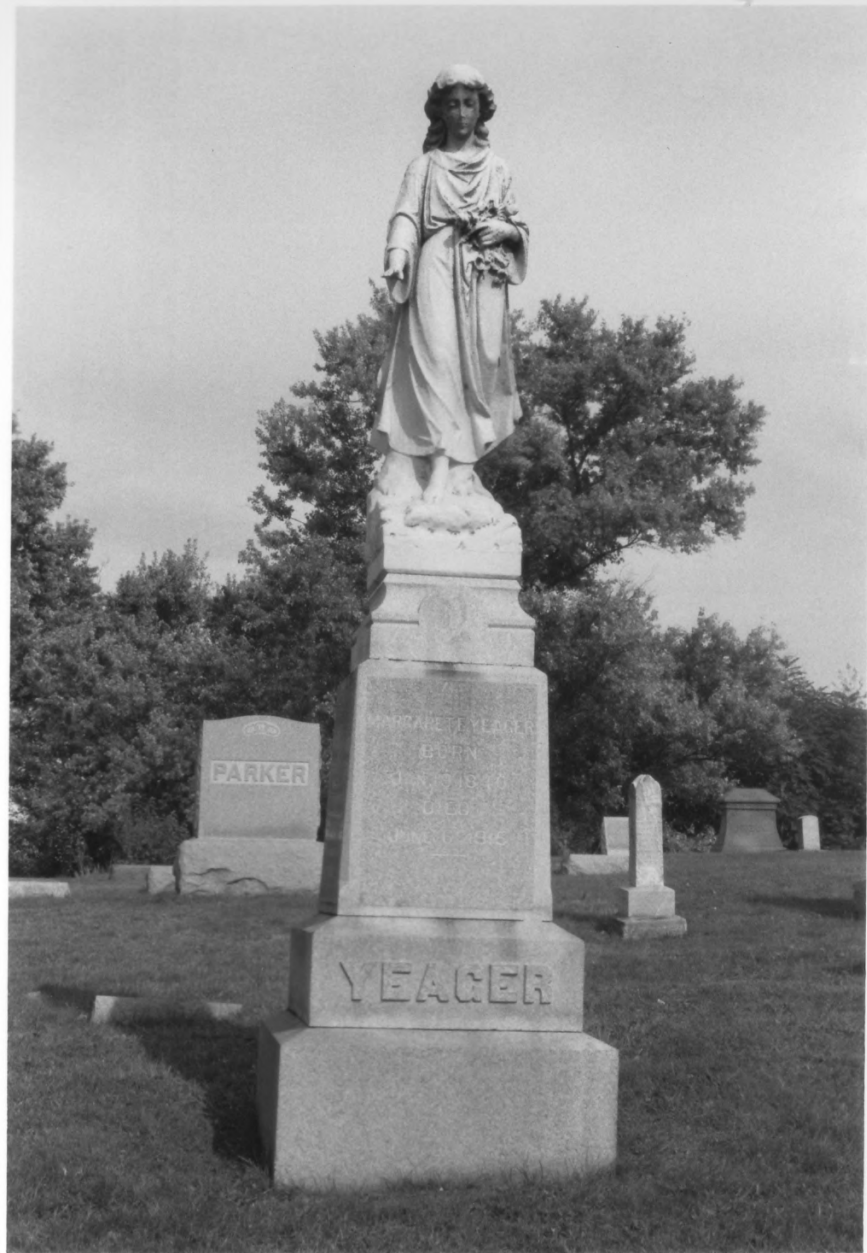

SHE GAVE STRENGTH AND COURAGE TO THE UNION SOLDIERS
OF THE STATE BY SYSTEMATIC ORGANIZATION
OF THE WOMEN TOWARD SUPPLYING
THEIR SPIRITUAL AND PHYSICAL WANTS

UNDER HER DIRECTION FLAGS WERE MADE
AND SUPPLIES SENT TO THE SANITARY COMMISSION

SOON AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE WAR SHE ORGANIZED
IN RICHMOND THE FIRST MEMORIAL DAY WHICH WAS LATER
MADE NATIONAL THROUGH AN ORDER OF HER FRIEND
GENERAL JOHN A. LOGAN, COMMANDER IN CHIEF

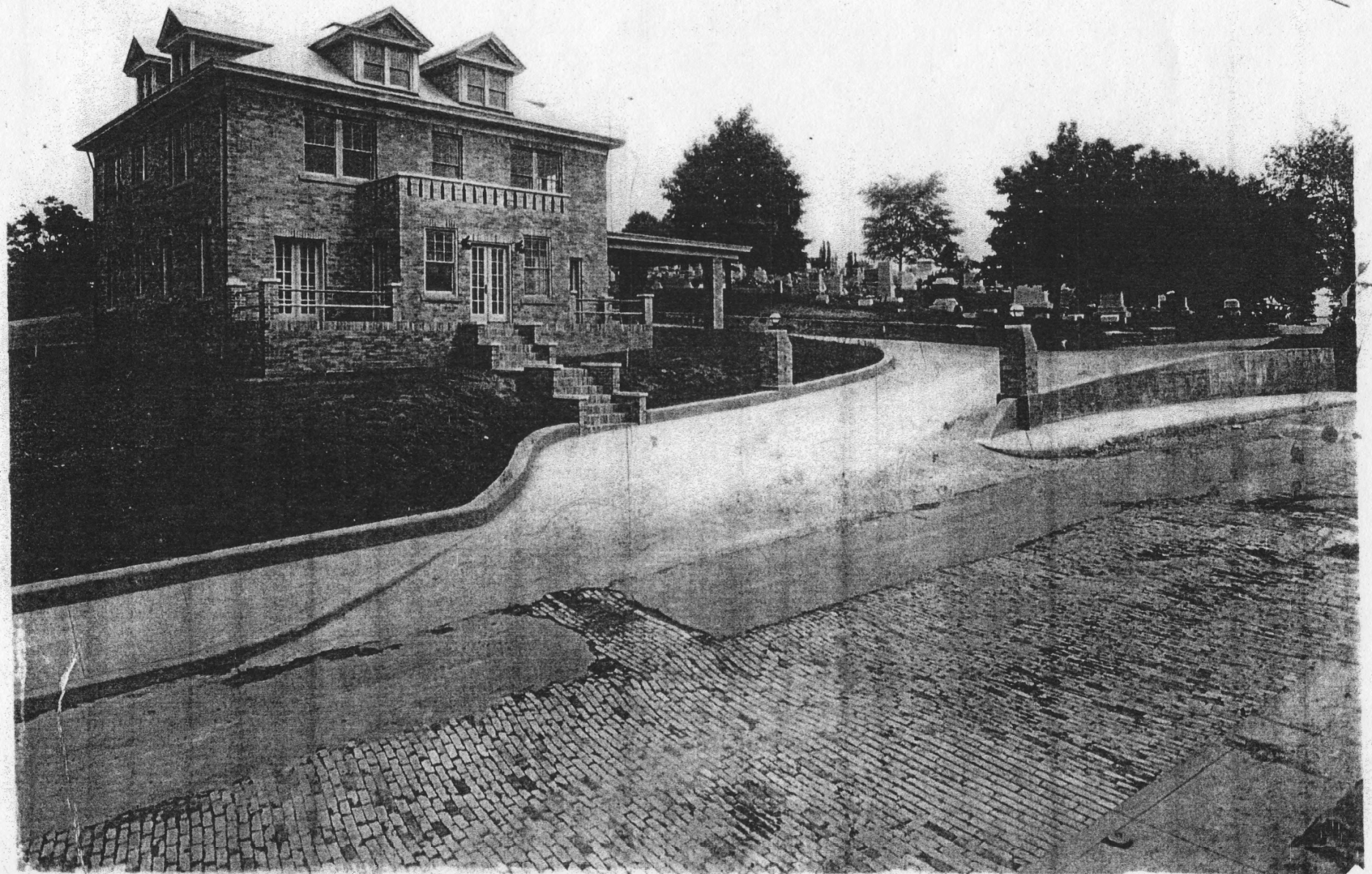

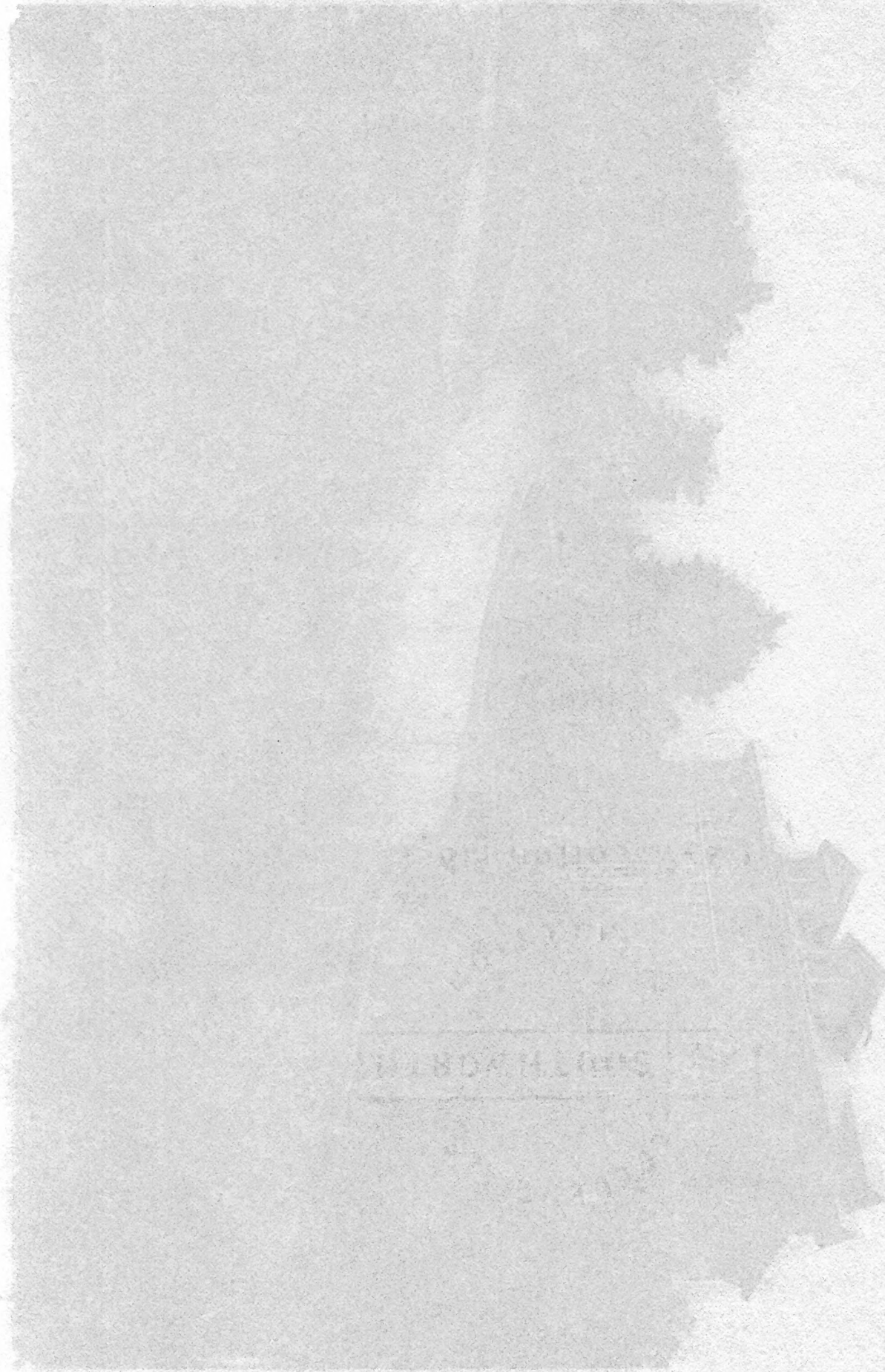
