#316 Daws-Keys House, 421 N. Church, ill. 37.

4. Owner: Claudio Chavez, 421 N. Church, Aztec, N.M.

7. Description: Clapboard over frame; small enclosed eaves with frieze board below; simple molding cornice over doors and windows; slender porch posts. Grape arbor as fence in front, 1930's cobblestone wall in rear.

Located in a residential area one block north of the proposed residential district.

8. Significance: While most of the many Hipped Cottages built during the decade after the arrival of the railroad have been greatly remodeled, the Daws-Keys House remains intact. As a result, it is a fine reminder of this important type. The symmetrical massing and porch are the predominant features. The slender porch columns and asymmetrical window placement represent the continuing influence of the earlier picturesque house types. Water from the residential irrigation system supplies the grape arbor which clings to the front fence.
