DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

"At Titusville a beautiful church has been completed, and funds obtained for the erection of a comfortable rectory." Such was an 1889 description of St. Gabriel's. Originally one of the best proportioned churches on the East Coast dating from this period, the building has been very recently widened. As it presently exists, the church appears small and rather modest. /It is of frame construction and painted white. The plan is a modified cruciform with a central aisle and two short side aisles. This affords limited seating for the congregation. is an altar in the apsidal end of the church behind which is the St. Gabriel stained glass window. It was with the donation of this window that the name of the church was changed from St. John's to St. Gabriel's in 1888. affidavit to this effect is on file in the Brevard County Courthouse). The interior of the church is supported by exposed beams giving the effect of a Gothic hall. Light filters in through stained glass windows only. The floors and pews are of a dark hard wood adding to the overall feeling of darkness inside the church.

On the exterior, St. Gabriel's seems somewhat skeletal. This feeling is intensified by the use of slender pieces of wood arranged in a tracery pattern and placed below the roof, in the railing and above the windows. All windows employ the pointed arch. The roof is of a steep pitch with four cross gables on each side. There is a large steeple at the southeast corner of the building which houses a bell/given by the ladies of the church and installed in 1892.

The neo-Gothic style of Titusville's "village church" reflects a trend in Episcopal architecture at the time of its construction. Known within the Episcopal Church as Bishop Weed Gothic, the style spread through the efforts of Edwin Gardner Weed, third Bishop of Florida. A number of churches constructed in the 1880's reflected this neo-Gothic trend and the area of influence seems to have been widespread. Christ Church in Monticello was constructed in 1886, the Church of the Good shepherd in Maitland in 1880 and the Episcopal Church at Enterprise was built in 1883. St. Gabriel's, built in 1887, reflects some of the most outstanding characteristics of the style and remains today in an excellent state of repair.

In 1887, a large lot consisting of almost an entire block was jointly given to the congregation of St. Gabriel's mission by Mary E. Titus, wife of the city's founder and J. Dunlin Perkinson, pioneer lay reader for the mission. The land was to be used for the construction of an Episcopal church with the surplus to be used for a cemetary. A graveyard was to surround the church in much the same manner as the country parishes of England and Virginia. Due to the hostility of the town council to the idea of a graveyard within the city limits, the plan was never carried out.

In 1887, construction began on the church and in 1892, the bell, which is the largest in Brevard County, was installed. The church contains one of the finest collections of Victorian stained glass in the Indian River country. 313

Perhaps the single most significant statement which can be made about St. Gabriel's is that it reflects a style or architecture which is indigenous to Florida and that this style spread through the efforts and influences of one man, Bishop Edwin Weed.
