

Description and House Plan: 45.

The Mason House is a two story brick structure with a hip roof and interior end chimneys. Brick pilasters separate the flemish bond facade into five bays and delineate the corners. The windows are 6 over 6 with jack arches. The one bay, one story, central porch has a flat roof and is supported by paired square brick posts. The second floor central window over the porch is flanked by sidelights. The central doorway is recessed with an entablature, four light sidelights and a three light transom. The doors are double leaf. The other facades are six course common bond. The residence has a stone foundation. The ell on the east side of the house is two story with a gable roof. The south side of the ell has a two bay recessed porch with square brick columns. The north side originally had a one story porch with a shed roof. The porch has been enclosed with glass.



Statement of Significance

The Mason House is significant under criterion C for circa 1853 as an example of the Greek Revival style in Madison County. Greek Revival details such as the entablature around the doorway, pilasters, a one-story, one-bay flat-roofed porch, and jack arches are used on a single-pile central passage plan.

Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary was chosen arbitrarily to provide a minimal setting for the house.

The boundary contains one contributing building.
