#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

This rectangular, wood frame church has clapboard siding, a gable roof and a belfry. Designed in a transitional Greek Revival-Italianate style, the church features pilasters, cornice returns and a pedimented entrance on the narrow gable end (north) that exemplify Greek Revival style influences. The use of brackets and round arched belfry apertures, as well as a lunette in the gable end, are evidence of Italianate influences. The long windows consist of groups of four double-hung sash with two-over-two lights.

The interior of the church remains as unaltered as the exterior and is dominated by the trompe 'loeil wall and ceiling paintings. This artwork employs a classical motif and includes a triumpal arch over the pulpit and a ceiling medallion with Greek floral designs. Also original are the pews and the Empire style tracker organ, pulpit and sofa.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

This simple and traditional mid-nineteenth century church is destinguished by the finely executed trompe l'oeil fresco work carried out on the walls and ceiling of the sanctuary. Of the four known churches in Maine where this style of decoration is employed, that appearing in this building is the earliest, having been done by William Lawlor of Boston at the time of construction in 1853.

Although built by the Universalists the church within the last fifty years has become non-denominational and serves the community as a whole.
