SIGNIFICANCE

SUMMARY

The Punta Gorda Depot is significant at the local level under Criterion A for its association with the railroad industry in Punta Gorda and under Criterion C as an excellent, and rare example of the Mediterranean Revival style in Punta Gorda. The Depot contributes to the Punta Gorda Multiple Property Group under Associated Historic Context: Exploration, Settlement and Early Development of Punta Gorda, 1884-1930, and Associated Property Type: Buildings of Punta Gorda, 1884-1930. The one story structure is an excellent example of the subtype, Industrial Architecture.

The railroad's arrival in Punta Gorda in 1886 greatly predated the linkage of Fort Myers in 1912 and Naples in 1928 to the system. The commercial fishing industry, the lively trade sector, and the grand hotel business of Punta Gorda are attributed to the railroad. The Punta Gorda Depot was the third depot constructed in the town and reflects the continous growth of the city through the Florida Land Boom period of the 1920s.

The architecture of the depot is significant. The building is unaltered and retains the details and character of the Mediterranean Revival style that have become the trademark for the Florida Boom period. The Depot is an excellent example of the style as presented on a public transportation building.

CONCLUSION

The Punta Gorda Depot played a significant role in the success of both the fishing and railroad industries in Punta Gorda from 1913 to 1939. Without this facility, fish catches could not be shipped to northern markets. It is the only tangible link to the railroad industry left in Punta Gorda with the exception of actual railroad tracks and beds.

DESCRIPTION

SUMMARY

The Punta Gorda Atlantic Coast Line Depot, located at 1009 Taylor Road, in Punta Gorda, constructed in 1928, contributes to the Punta Gorda Multiple Property Group under Associated Property Type, Buildings of Punta Gorda, 1884-1930. The one story structure is an excellent example of the subtype, Industrial Architecture.

The 1928 Punta Gorda Depot, located at 1009 Taylor Street, is an excellent example of the Mediterranean Revival style of architecture as employed on a commercial building. Oriented on a longitudinal axis parallel to the tracks, the building is the only structure on the site.

The north elevation of the depot is the most elaborately designed facade with two wide arches supported by brick piers. A curvilinear parapet is separated from the open arcaded entry by a shed awning clad in clay barrel tile.

The east elevation, which was trackside, features a two story tower which has a hipped roof clad in clay barrel tile. Windows are currently boarded up. A shed awning of clay barrel tile, supported by heavy wood brackets, shades the interior of the dock.

The south elevation is open on three sides, to support the function of the loading dock.

The west elevation is the streetside facade, which is not elaborately detailed.

Most of the structure's function was dedicated to freight handling. The passenger portion, located in the northern end of the building, is separated from the freight area by a firewall. A chimney and fireplace provided warmth for the waiting room during the winter.
