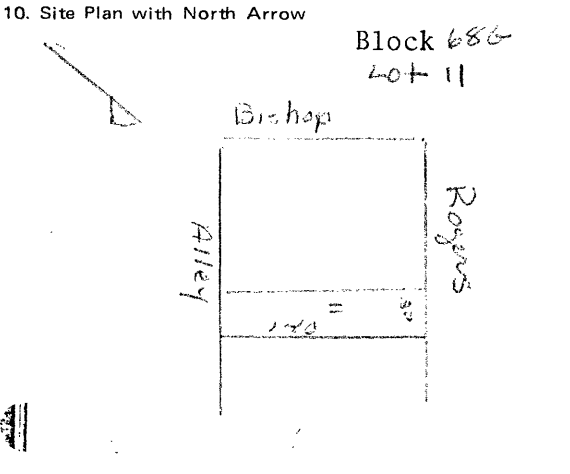

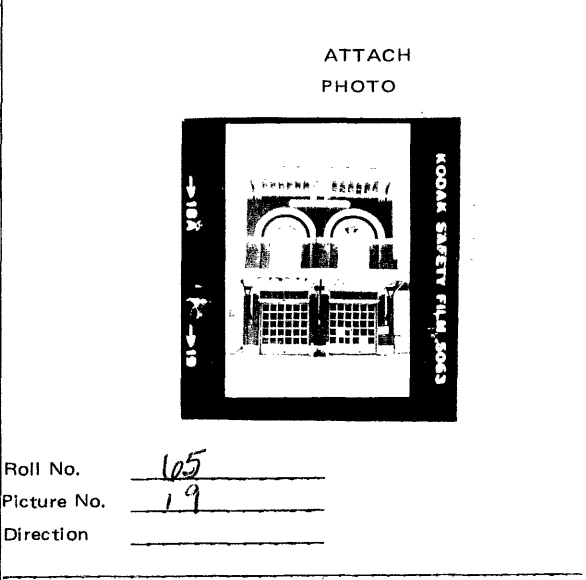

Engin House No. 11 is a two-story brick structure. The first floor has two large doors with tramnsoms. A stone band forms a lintel over the doors. A porch with wrought iron brackets has been added. The second floor has two large windows with fanlights. The lower section of the windows are boarded at this time. The windows are set in brick recesses with stone banding. The name "Vincent Bradas" is still (over)

19. History  
This structure was constructed in 1883 and served the Irish Hill and Phoenix Hill areas.



20. Significance  
This structure is a fine example of Victorian design in a small scale public building. The building is the major architectural element on Rogers Street which consist primarily of late Victorian frame shotguns.

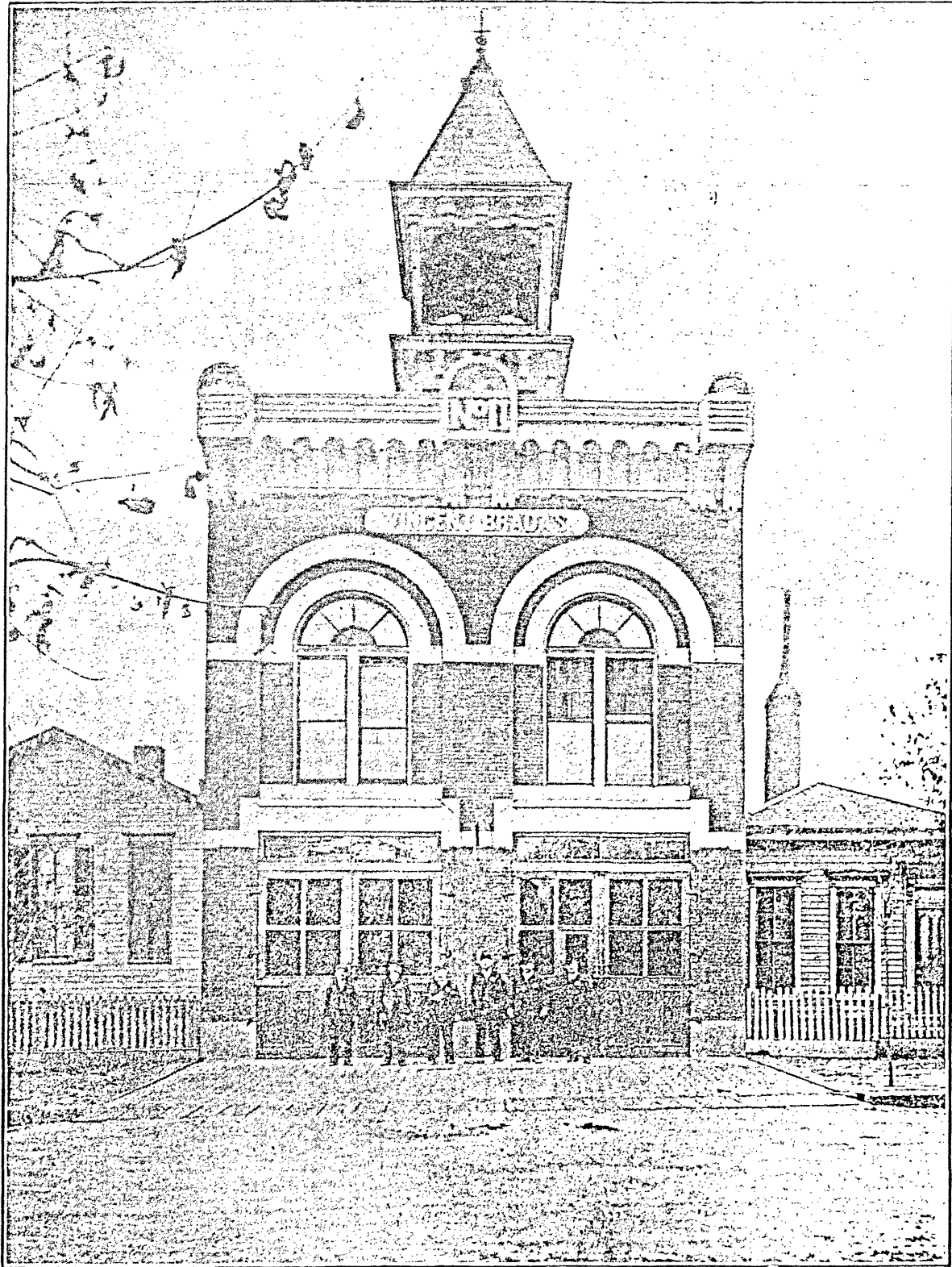
