Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Table Rock Opera House is located on the west side of the Table Rock town square, on Houston Street. Constructed in 1893 by G. R. "Rice" Martin, a local merchant, this Two-Part Commercial Block structure measures about 45 feet wide by 70 feet long. The flat roof has been protected by layers of tar. The facade is quite plain for a Nebraska opera house built in the nineteenth century, having only stone window ledges, simple stone decorations above the windows, and a section of bricks raised above the roof level on the front facade, reminiscent of the line of a false front. Access to the second-floor auditorium is through double doors between two retail establishments on the ground floor and through another set of double doors into the opera house itself. No ticket window remains. Retail space also existed on the second floor under the balcony on each side of the theatre's entrance.

The auditorium is 44 feet wide between side walls and 38 feet, six inches deep from the proscenium opening to the back wall of the auditorium. The sharply raked balcony extends 14 feet behind the auditorium's back wall. It is reached by narrow stairs along both auditorium walls. Four windows in the east wall provide natural lighting into the balcony, as does a skylight above the center of the auditorium. The wooden floor is in good condition.

The wooden proscenium arch measures 20 feet wide by about 14 feet high. There are ample twelve-foot wings on each side of the stage. The proscenium wall angles away from the proscenium opening (see floor plan continuation sheet 7.1). This triangle-shaped space has built-in storage for wooden folding chairs on the stage side of the stage right wing. No dressing rooms exist backstage, although there is ample space. Access to the backstage area is through doors on the proscenium wall near the outside walls of the auditorium. A three-foot apron curves away from the proscenium opening. The stage is 15 feet deep from the curtain line to the back wall. Wainscoting decorates the front of the stage below the level of the stage floor. One trap door is located center stage. One of the most unusual features of this opera house is the presence of two complete sets of original stage scenery, set up and operational in the on-stage grooves.

The structural and historical integrity of the building and theatre has been preserved.



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The three-story brick rectangular building has a flat roof with a "false-front" stepped parapet wall. Fenestration consists of double-hung window units with one over one pane arrangement. Window hoods and sills are of stone. The double store features an original cast iron storefront with double-door entry on the main (east) facade, south side. The north storefront has been modernized with plate glass windows, new brick and single door entry. The center double door entry with large transom, leads to the second level opera house. Except for these storefront alterations, the building remains in good condition.

The building, now owned by the Table Rock Historical Society, originally housed retail businesses, including a drug store, on the first level and professional office space, including a dentists office, at the front of the second level. The first floor presently houses a drug store and appliance shop, and the opera house space is used as the Old Opera House Museum.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Table Rock Opera House is significant for its association with and in reference to the historic context "Aesthetic Systems: Itinerant and Local Performing Arts in Nebraska" and the property type of "Opera House Buildings in Nebraska, 1867 to 1917." Under Criterion A, this opera house is significant in the areas of the performing arts; entertainment/recreation; and social history, on a state level, as a well preserved example of an opera house building in Nebraska. The building retains a high degree of historical integrity, possessing the physical and associative characteristics to make it an eligible member of its property type.

This opera house is significant in the area of performing arts for bringing a variety of entertainment to the community of Table Rock. As a facility for the performing arts, it offered productions such as musical concerts, comic opera, minstrel shows, touring stock companies, magicians, and home talent productions. (See following table of Representative Entertainments 1893-1917.)

This opera house is significant in the area of entertainment/recreation, since it provided a place where the whole community could gather to attend dances, lectures, and moving pictures. (See following table of Representative Entertainments 1893-1917.)

This opera house is significant in the area of social history, because it gave Table Rock a neutral, nonaffiliated location for lodge celebrations, political speeches, fundraisers, suffrage meetings, and school recitals. (See following table of Representative Entertainments 1893-1917.) In the days before radio, television, and sound movies, activities at the opera house were anticipated for days or weeks ahead of time. It provided a place for people to get together to have a good time and forget their troubles over crops, weather, taxes, the railroads, and the generally hard life of settling the Great Plains.

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The period of significance is derived from the original construction date of the building, 1893. It continues through 1917, the year considered to signal the end of the opera house era in Nebraska, based on declining numbers of touring companies nationally and rising numbers of movie houses and automobiles. The local opening of the Pastime Theatre, circa 1916, took considerable business away from the Table Rock Opera House. Limited choices in the Table Rock Opera House doomed it to a dwindling number of sporadic events.
