

The original water tower still stands in Fresno, having been kept and maintained in an excellent condition. The tower, approximately 100 feet high, and with a storage capacity of 250,000 gallons in its water tank, was completed in November of 1894. It is constructed of ordinary red bricks, each layer smaller than the one below it, to produce a beehive effect. It also has a thick inner wall, over two feet in thickness, and an outer wall of about fourteen inches. There is a passage, or hollow space, about three feet wide between the two walls. The outside of the tower has a painted surface over the brick construction.


Original plans called for three floors to be constructed under the tank itself, however, only a second floor was constructed with its entrance by a winding staircase. The second level then, has a very high ceiling.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In 1891 George W. Mayer, a Chicago architect, was commissioned to design Fresno's new water tower. The great Chicago fire had taken place twenty-three years earlier, and Mr. Mayer had been impressed by two things in that year of 1871. Chicago Public Library had been burned to the ground; and second, the Chicago Water Tower had survived and was used as a temporary city library as books began being replaced by various donors. Evidently Mr. Mayer thought highly of a library in the water tower, because his plans for the Fresno Tower were modeled after the Chicago tower and included provision for the library. Fortunately for future library patrons, this part of the architect's plan was never adopted. The second floor of the tower was built, but the third level was never added. Fresno Water Tower, since its completion in 1894, was in constant use until 1963 when the pumping machinery was no longer The real value of the building, now that it no longer adequate. stores water, is to be found in its graceful beauty, its symmetry and its stately other century charm.
