DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Built in 1911 the Baynham House is a two-story wood structure with a half-basement. The house measures 32x44 feet. The first story has approximately 1400 square feet of living area. The second story has approximately 1200 square feet.

At the time of construction the Baynham House was recognized as one of the finest houses in Success, Arkansas. It was constructed of the best materials. Mr. Baynham was in the retail lumber business, therefore giving him the opportunity to purchase the best of materials for the house.

The house features a combination hip and gable roof. Originally of wood shingles, it now is covered with composition shingles. The house has a porch across the front.

The first story consist of a foyer (in which is the stairway leading to the second story), a living room, dining room, den, kitchen, dinette, and a large utility room. The steps to the basement are behind the dinette and south of the kitchen. A door opens out of the kitchen; also a door leading to the basement comes in from the outside at the south-west corner of the back.

The walls and ceilings were of wood and papered with wall paper. At the present time, the hall, living room, dining room, kitchen and dinette are papered. The cabinets are green matching wall paper. The den has birch paneling on the walls and features a wood burning fireplace.

The second story has hall, four bedrooms and bathroom. A large bedroom on the front of the second story has birch paneling on the walls. The bathroom and the other three bedrooms have wall paper on the walls.

The Baynham House has been well-perserved and is in excellent condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The significance of the Baynham House is the period of time it was built. A time when Success was at a peak of industry in timber and agriculture.

The Baynham House was built by the late Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Baynham. Mrs. Baynham was the daughter of J. W. Black, founder of J. W. Black Lumber Company in the late 1800's, at Corning, Arkansas, in Clay County.

The Baynham's were in the hardware and retail lumber business in Success for many years.

Mrs. Baynham was postmistress of Success for several years. The Baynham's had two daughters, Rosalie and Louise. Mrs. Charles (Rosalie) Bowers lived in Corning, Arkansas, until her death. Mrs. Louise Scott is living in Corning at the present time.

The house was sold to Mr. and Mrs. George Rahm in the early Forties. Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Smithson purchased the house from Mr. and Mrs. Rahm in the middle Fifties. Mrs. Smithson was the granddaughter of the late Captain Joe McCracken, a prominent pioneer of Success, and the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Joe McCracken well known prominent family.

Mrs. Smithson sold the house to Mr. and Mrs. Joey Lewis after the death of her husband in 1975. These four families that have owned the house are all descendants of Clay County pioneers.

The primary significance of the Baynham House is historic and would make a good impression for visitation to former Clay Countians to tour that remember Success at a peak of industry of timber, sawmilling and agriculture. Success at this time had two banks, two cotton gins, three doctors, a stove factory, and other retail business that makes up a thriving town. This was brought about by the building of the railroad by St. Louis-San Francisco Railway Company, one of the first rail services in Clay County.

Success is one of the oldest towns in Clay County, Arkansas, first known as Heckt Community, later becoming a town known as Bridgeport. The name was changed to Success about 1900.

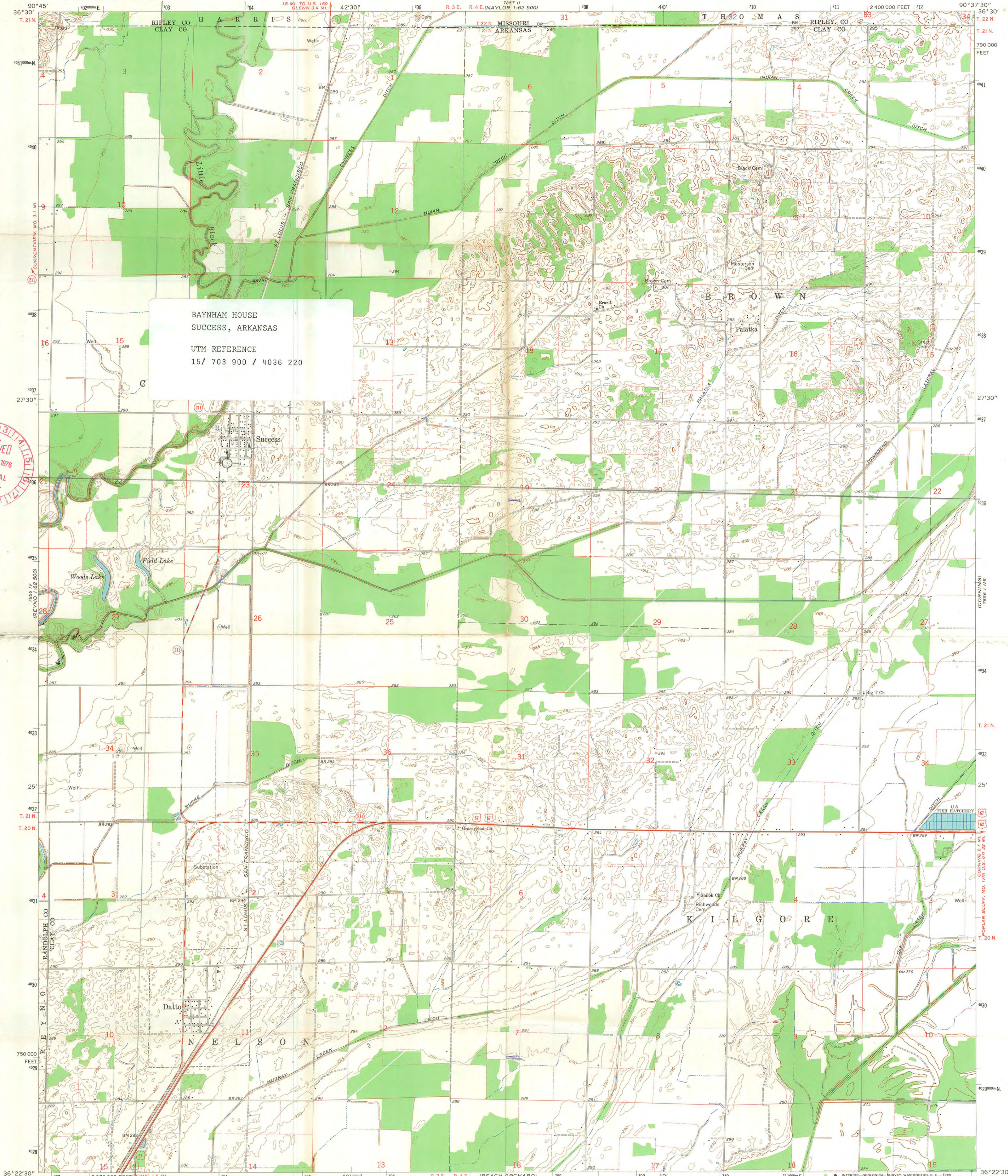
