
Designed by major Davenport architects F.G. Claussen and Parke Burrows, St. John's is a good example of turn-of-the-century Gothic Revival, built of light-colored rockfaced stone. Rather than the soaring verticality often characteristic of the Gothic style, this church, despite the tower pointed arches and profusion of finials, presents a massing of solid, geometrical forms and relatively low profile; emphasized by the strongly horizontal masonry coursing.

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This church building is associated with a moderately important protestant congregation in the community that resulted from the merger of two smaller groups. However, it had no statewide religious role and had no major church leaders associated with it.

DESCRIPTION

St. John's Methodist Church was formed in 1899 operating under the name "Central Methodist." It resulted from the merger of First Methodist and Fourteenth Street Methodist Churches. The new St. John's Church was constructed in 1903. St. John's membership was English speaking and non-black at the turn of the century.
