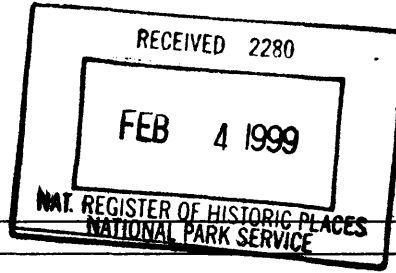

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The Idlewild Historic District is a significant, mixed residential and commercial area of approximately 401 principal structures built between ca. 1890 and ca. 1945 in various subdivisions along the principal axis of Peabody Avenue in the area generally referred to as Midtown in Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee. A large majority of the principal buildings are contributing resources in the district.

The district is composed of eighteen city blocks in an area generally bounded by Rembert Street on the west, Central Avenue on the south, South Cooper Street on the east, and Linden Avenue on the north. The irregular street pattern created a pattern of mixed block shapes and sizes, ranging from simple square blocks to long, rectangular blocks only one lot deep.

The topography of the district is gently rolling, generally rising from its low point along Rembert Street to its highest elevation at Summit Street. The topographic character of the district was shaped, in part, by the swale of Lick Creek, located generally along the Rembert Street corridor. The creek was channeled into a culvert and covered ca. 1905 -10 to permit additional residential development in the district.

Subdivision development overlaid on the topography required many streets to be cut into the slopes of the area. As a result, many of the blocks in the district have low terraces for the setting of residences. Some of these terraces are retained by low masonry walls while others slope gently to the street.

The landscape character of the district is notable for its plantings of mature trees along streets and in yards; there are notable areas of the district where the tree canopy spans the street. Varieties of street and yard trees found in the district include red and white oak, red gum, magnolia, tulip poplar, sycamore, and red maple. Individual yards vary in their landscape character, but many are planted with ornamental shrubs and trees including holly, crepe myrtle, mahonia, red bud, dogwood, and box wood.

The pattern of individual lots within the district varies widely, in part due to the irregular street pattern and in part due to factors of natural topography and other development patterns. In general terms, lots within the district are rectangular in shape with frontages that range from 35' to 150'; lot depths also range widely from 75' to more than 240'. There are exceptions to this pattern, including the block bounded by Rembert, Vinton, Diana and Peabody, where an irregular lot pattern was created by the alignment of Lick Creek through this part of the district.

The development of the district over its period of significance has produced architectural diversity in its residential and commercial character, as might be expected for an area developed over such a long period of time. Like other "edge" developments at the turn of the twentieth century in Memphis, residential house types developed in the district included the shotgun, the double-shotgun, the modified shotgun, the cubical cottage, the L-plan cottage, the composite cottage, and variations of these forms. Architectural styles applied to these structures includes the Italianate and the Queen Anne styles. The setting of these earlier structures often lacks driveway cuts, since the some area's development occurred as a streetcar suburb, prior to the era of the individual automobile.

Following the turn of the century, the area grew with more homogeneity, continuing many of the same house types for the next decade but also adding the diversity of the bungalow, the four-square, the Cape, the English cottage, the double-pile cottage and variations of these forms. Architectural styles applied to these structures included the Queen Anne, the Colonial Revival, the Craftsman, the Tudor Revival and the Minimal Traditional styles. There are reflections of commercial types and styles appropriate to the times reflected in the commercial buildings of the district constructed during this same period.

The structures to be found in the district are described in the following inventory. Structures built during the period of significance which retain their architectural integrity contribute to the district's historical character and are labeled (C). Structures built after the period of significance, or those which have been so altered as to have lost their architectural integrity, do not contribute to the district's character and are labeled (NC).

NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Idlewild Historic District is being nominated under criterion C in the area of architecture for its significant collection of late-nineteenth and early twentieth century residential and commercial architecture developed in the period between ca. 1890 and 1945. The wide variety of house types, architectural styles, and of the materials used in their construction reflect the evolutionary history of the district over its period of significance from a remote streetcar suburb to that of an urban automobile suburb. The commercial resources found at the district's edge were developed along the street car line in response to the growing market for neighborhood services, and thus, reflect the maturation of the area as a well-rounded community.

The period of significance begins with the establishment of the Idlewild Subdivision ca. 1890, and ends with the end of World War Two, at which time, building types, patterns and materials changed radically from those characteristics in evidence in the district.

During the 1880s, the area of Memphis between the current day Parkways and the then existing city limit at Walnut and East Streets near the so-called "Midtown Loop" of Interstate 240 was an area still largely composed of farm properties and rural estates, represented by the likes of the Rozelle plantation (1737 Harbert Avenue, ca. 1850, part Central Gardens Historic District, NR 9/9/1982), the Eli Rayner House (1020 Rayner Street, NR 5/09/1977) and other early properties. The farms and estates were tied together by a widely scattered grid of public roads developed on shared property lines, including Cooper Street, Central Avenue, Union Avenue and Madison Avenue, among others.

Commonly known as "East End" prior to ca. 1905, and today known as "Midtown," the rural character of this area began to change beginning in 1884-1887 with the creation of three major developments in the area-- Montgomery Park, the Citizen's East End Railroad, and East End Park. The establishment of Montgomery Park (1884) on the site of the current Mid-South Fairgrounds created a major new site for public amusements, the focus of which were the horse races held by the Memphis Jockey Club. The popularity of Montgomery Park caused real estate interests in the area to charter the Citizens Street Railway Company in 1887, operating its suburban "East End Dummy Line" as a connection between the old city with Montgomery Park. On the site of the former McLean Homestead at Tucker and Madison Avenue, the new trolley company also developed its own pleasure ground called East End Park, which opened to the public in 1887.

The effect of the East End Dummy Line through the area can not be understated in its importance to the residential development in the Midtown area before ca. 1900. The rail line not only connected the public with the attractions of East End Park and Montgomery Park, but it also enabled families of

every income level to seek housing opportunities outside of the old Memphis urban core, and yet be connected with the workplace in the old city by a simple commute on the trolley line. The effect of the trolley line on suburbanization of the East End area in the 1890s was similar to the effect that interstate-quality highways cause in the suburbanization of major cities in America today. The difference, of course, was that in the era before the automobile, development tended to occur within an easy walking distance from the street car line. The other contrast, of course, is that pre-World War Two trolley lines operated in tandem with existing traffic over established streets, serving to knit together the developing urban fabric of cities, instead of separating neighborhoods as does the Interstate system.

The "Dummy Line" extended out of the old core of Memphis along Madison Avenue, turning south on Cooper Street, then east again on Young Avenue to reach Montgomery Park. Within the first five years of its operation, several major areas of subdivision development were begun, including the Mount Arlington subdivision (1890, part Cooper-Young Historic District, NR 6/22/1989), the Idlewild Subdivision (1889, part Central Gardens Historic District, NR 9/09/1982), and the Lenox Subdivision (1890).

Concurrent with the onset of suburban development in the East End area was a burgeoning progressive political movement, begun ca. 1895 by an association of businessmen, civic interests and real estate interests called "The Committee of One Hundred." Some of the figures involved were some of the same real estate developers responsible for the Citizens Street Railway Company and the various East End subdivisions. The Committee first formally proposed a progressive agenda for the city during the mayoral election of 1895, which included annexation of an extensive area east from the city limits to the East End and the extension of city sewers and water lines into the annexed area to spur residential development (*Memphis Evening Scimitar*, 1899:2-3). Though the progressive agenda was not adopted by any of the mayoral candidates in 1895, the effect of the attention it gained was immediate.

It is not clear whether the progressive's push for annexation of the East End was a reaction to earlier calls for the incorporation of some of the eastern subdivisions, or whether the incorporation efforts in these areas came as a reaction to the progressive's public efforts. Which ever the case, a wave of incorporation efforts was set in motion in the East End, resulting in the incorporation of the Town of Idlewild in September of 1895 (*The Commercial Appeal*, September 11, 1895), among others. The Town of Idlewild was incorporated with boundaries that included Mosby Street (now Belvedere) on the west, Poplar Avenue and Madison Avenue on the north, Tucker Street and Cooper Street on the east, and Harbert Street on the south.

The progressive agenda for Memphis returned to the fore-front of public debate in the mayoral election of 1897. By this time, the agenda had been given the name of "The Greater Memphis Movement" and it was heartily endorsed by both candidates for election, J. J. Williams and W. L. Clapp. Williams captured the attention of the voters first in endorsing the Greater Memphis Movement, and following his election, moved to implement the agenda immediately. The first action taken was for the city to take formal action to annex the twelve square miles of suburban territory, stretching out to the East End as far as Cooper Street. The city's efforts were stalled in 1898 by a ruling of the Tennessee Supreme Court that struck down certain provisions of the state's annexation law; the state legislature enacted corrections to the annexation law later in that year which allowed the City to proceed (*Commercial Appeal* June 12, 1898). Annexation of Idlewild was made formal in 1899.

In the period between ca. 1890 and 1899, the portions of Idlewild that lie in the proposed district saw rather modest development of residential and commercial resources. Sanborn maps and city directories for this period show concentrations of development along the major streets of the district, particularly along Linden, Courtland, Cowden and Harbert avenues covering perhaps a third of its total developed area today.

Other resources were developed in Idlewild during the period immediately prior to annexation and in the period which followed that reflect the unique development circumstances of the area; some of these resources have now become separated from the district due to subsequent redevelopment of the town after annexation. By example, the Idlewild Elementary School was built just west of the district on Linden Avenue in 1903 to replace an earlier town-run school; the school was included in the Belvedere Subdivision redevelopment of the southwestern portion of Idlewild in 1906 (Central Gardens NR 9/9/1982). Later, as the automobile gained in popularity as an everyday convenience, the redevelopment of originally modest streets into major transportation corridors, like Union Avenue and Madison Avenue, further divided the original "town" character of Idlewild into disparate parts. The proposed district is the largest of the remaining parts of the town-development of Idlewild.

The extant residential resources developed during the pre-annexation period in the district share common characteristics of house types and styles that set a rather unique architectural tone for the district and reflect its origin as a streetcar suburb. The developed patterns of shotgun, modified shotguns, composite cottages, modified composite cottages, and L-plan cottages built here in the pre-annexations era are different from those of those developed in the other major "edge" communities of its time, like the Mount Arlington Subdivision (Cooper-Young Historic District, NR 6/22/1989), the Town of Lenox, and the Town of Madison Heights, among others.

Survey data, city directories and Sanborn Fire Insurance maps combine to reveal that the pace of residential development quickened following the annexation of Idlewild, perhaps as the result of the extension of public water and sewer lines in the area. Subdivisions were created to overlay and extend development to the south of the original town limit at Harbert Avenue, creating the sense of a seamless neighborhood extending from Linden to and including Central Avenue. The vast majority of the existing residential development in the district occurred between 1905 and 1915. Variations on the bungalow house form were introduced to the neighborhood during this period, along with the Craftsman architectural style. Many of the earlier house types continued to be built; the shotgun, composite cottage forms were among them, but they were built as often with Craftsman styling as with the Colonial Revival. Other housing types emerged during the post-annexation era, including the four-square and the English cottage, among others. Housing development in the area was largely complete by ca. 1920, though scattered vacant lots remained to be developed or redeveloped through the 1930s.

The growth of a significant residential population in the area of the district caused the development of complementary resources to service the maturing community. The Union Avenue Methodist Episcopal Church, South (NR 3/06/1987) was developed at the corner of Union Avenue and South Cooper Street in 1913, and the Union Avenue Baptist Church (2181 Union Avenue) was developed ca. 1915 to serve the spiritual needs of the neighboring communities. (Both are outside the district.)

A key resource developed in the district was the Tanglewood Well Field and Pumphouse, built in 1906 and operated on the site of Peabody Park until 1922. During most of the period from 1912 to 1922, the Tanglewood Well Field supplied most of the city of Memphis with its public water supply. The park's distinctive bandstand, built with its formal redevelopment as a park ca. 1922, remains standing in the park today. The Skinner Center for the Disabled occupies the site of the original Tanglewood Pump Station.

The history of the neighborhood is also reflected in the development of its commercial resources. The original "downtown" area of the Town of Idlewild was located along Madison Avenue, well to the north of the district. However, as the market for neighborhood services grew, the development of commercial resources followed the trolley line to the eastern edge of the district. The commercial cluster at the intersections of South Cooper, Peabody Avenue and Linden Avenue retains excellent examples of both types of commercial structures that developed over the first three decades of this century, including the particularly fine stone-veneer store building 243-47 South Cooper, built in 1912. Other significant commercial resources developed nearby in the district include the commercial blocks at 549 and 551-553 South Cooper, built ca. 1915 and ca. 1929, respectively, and the Park Avenue F & AM Masonic Lodge at 539 South Cooper, built in 1941.

By the onset of World War Two, commercial structures occupied many lots on the south side of South Cooper running north from Vinton Avenue to Union Avenue. The redevelopment of some properties with new structures along South Cooper began in the 1950s, replacing some earlier commercial uses and residences with larger stores and service-oriented businesses. Other former residences were converted to commercial use in the 1960s and 1970s.

In spite of the changes along South Cooper since World War Two, the commercial corridor still retains a strong sense of identity and pride of place as part of its immediate community. Though the housing stock in parts of the district was once run down, in general terms, a recent wave of revitalization activity has added renewed vigor to the district, in part due to the convenience and quality of the small, neighborhood businesses which remain on South Cooper.

The Idlewild Historic District is a unique area in the City of Memphis. It is a place which can historically and physically demonstrate the experience of a formerly independent town that grew within the expanding suburban development of Memphis at the turn of the twentieth century. The district retains its sense of identity today, a sense bolstered in part by the great diversity and quality of its architectural character.

GEOGRAPHICAL DATA

Verbal Boundary Description

The property in nomination is an irregularly-shaped district generally bounded by South Cooper Street in part on the east, by the back property lines of properties along the north side of Linden Avenue, by Rembert Street on the west, and by the Nashville, Cincinnati and St. Louis Railroad right of way on the south, as delineated on the enclosed Shelby County tax maps.

Boundary Justification

The district being nominated contains the largest contiguous group of historic resources associated with the development of the southeastern quadrant of the Town of Idlewild before and after the annexation by the City of Memphis, as developed in the historic period of ca. 1890 to ca. 1945. Properties adjacent to, but not included in the district, are less than fifty years old and/or are buildings that do not retain their architectural or historical integrity. Properties in the district generally retain the same scale, setback, and character whether they are marked as contributing or noncontributing. The nominated property includes a small commercial area that was an important part of the development of Idlewild.

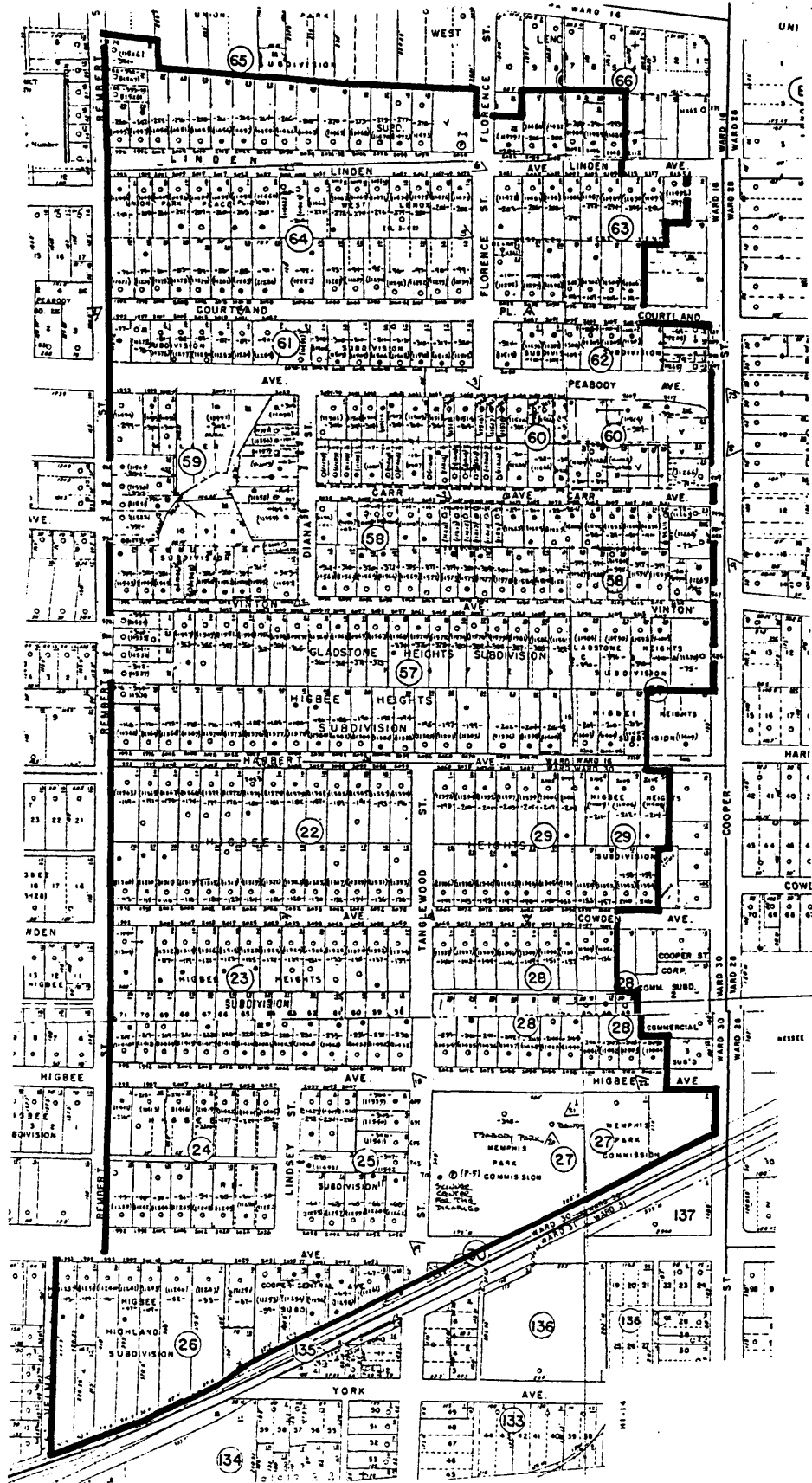
