

18. Description 1100-02 West Main is a three story brick, corner commercial building, now painted white. It is actually two buildings in one, with a common interior wall running lengthwise through its center. The exterior is a stylistic whole. Cast iron pilasters divide the first story facade into six, segmentally arched bays. 19. History The earliest record of this building is from an 1882 will of Isaac Wolf, a clothing merchant. The first recorded tenants are a boot and shoe factory and a whiskey concern, in 1883. At various times, the building has housed a cider and vinegar company, a pants factory, and a tobacco brokerage firm. J.V. Reed & Co., printers, have been located here since 1905.		32. 20. Significance This is one of the larger commercial structures, other than warehouses, left in the area. 18. other pilasters are lighter. The bays have been altered by addition of glass block. The two center bays contain six narrow windows each, resting on simple stone sills joined by brick string courses. The second story windows are segmentally arched, with brick voussoirs. On either side, brick pilasters rise to molded stone imposts from which spring segmental window hoods of stone. The third story windows are similar in style and scale, but round arched, with eyebrow-like hoods. A projecting cornice with dentil table crowns the building. One bracket in the right corner suggests that there may have been more at one time.
