The two center bays contain six narrow windows each, resting on simple stone sills joined by brick string courses. The second story windows are segmentally arched, with brick voussoirs. On either side, brick pilasters rise to molded stone imposts from which spring segmental window hoods of stone. The third story windows are similar in style and scale, but round arched, with eyebrow-like hoods. A projecting cornice with dentil table crowns the building. One bracket in the right corner suggests that there may have been more at one time.
