### Summary

The Carter House is located on the east side of School Avenue on a 75' by 150' lot in the northwestern part of a residential neighborhood of Hardy. Constructed c. 1947, the Carter House is an irregular-plan,, flagstone residence covered by a composition-shingled clipped-gable roof. The walls are constructed of random-sized, rough-cut, native stones that are laid without courses and are pointed conventionally without beads. Significant features include a clipped-gable front porch, a flagstone garage connected to the house, and a rock wall encircling three sides of the lot. There are two outbuildings on the property, a historic, novelty sided, side-gable building and a non-historic plywood structure.

### Elaboration

The front, or western, elevation contains a projecting clipped-gable front porch supported by two square flagstone columns with a short rock wall between the columns in place of a conventional balustrade. A single-leaf entrance is positioned to the south of the rear wall of the porch, and there is a pair of three-over-one wood windows to either side of the porch. A 30' concrete sidewalk leads to the street. It is bounded on the north by a short rock retaining wall for the driveway.

The south elevation consists of a pair of three-over-one windows, a group of three similar windows, a three-pane attic window, and a door to the basement. The basement is 10' by 20' and has a poured concrete floor. It still houses a hot water heater and furnace and was also used originally as a cellar for fruit and vegetables.

The rear, or eastern, elevation features a rear porch formed by a projecting clipped-gable roof that has been enclosed with six-over-six wood windows. The flagstone garage is connected to the northeast corner of the house by a short enclosed hall. The garage presents a clipped-gable and a large opening to the west, a regular gable and identical opening to the east, and a clipped-gable projection to the south. The interior of the garage consists of a poured concrete floor and tongue-and-groove ceiling.

The north elevation of the house has two pairs of three-over-one windows flanking a smaller, central three-over-one window and a three-pane attic window.

Inside, there is a living room, kitchen/dining room, and sitting room on the south side of the house and three bedrooms, two bathrooms, the laundry room, and a storage room on the north side. All of the floors were originally 2" width tongue-and-groove oak, though all are now covered. The front room, sitting room, hall and all three bedrooms are carpeted. The combination kitchen/dining room and both bathrooms have vinyl flooring. Most of the walls in the home are dry wall with the exception of some wood paneling in the storage room and laundry room. All of the ceilings are drywall except for the three bedrooms which have celotex tiles. The original pine floor, door, and window moldings remain.

The house is in excellent condition and has been altered on the exterior only by the addition of aluminum-frame storm windows and doors.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and period of significance noted above:

Constructed by Roy Lee Johnson for Fred and Doris Carter in the late 1940s, this residence was the first "rock house" to be constructed in the Shaver Addition in the town of Hardy. This area was formerly "tied up" in an estate and was not available for development until the 1940s. The Carter House, along with others on School Avenue, are also significant as the first generation of rock houses to be built for working class owners rather than for business owners or other professionals.

The Carter House is being nominated as part of the multiple-property nomination, "Historic and Architectural Resources of Hardy, Arkansas" under Criterion C with local significance as representative of the later evolution of rock houses in Hardy, and as a good example of a clipped-gable, flagstone-constructed residence with an attached garage.






