

#### Summary

The Pyatt School Building is a rectangular-shaped, single-story building constructed circa 1925 in the Plain Traditional style of architecture with some Colonial Revival influence. The composition-shingled hipped roof is pierced by two interior brick chimneys located at each end of the center ridge. Craftsman-style exposed rafters accentuate the eaves. The structural cut-stone walls feature "grapevine" mortaring and rest upon a continuous stone foundation.

#### Elaboration

The western or front elevation is comprised of a recessed, central porch flanked on each side by a set of six nine-over-nine, double-hung windows. Four slender, unfluted columns with simple round capitals and bases rest upon a concrete deck and support the pedimented gable roof, which projects somewhat.

The northern elevation contains a centrally placed raised doorway with a wood staircase. The lower portion has been filled and a window placed in the upper portion. A shed roof covers the filled-in lower half and is apparently used to store stove wood. Three six-over-six, double-hung windows to the east likewise have a shed roof built underneath, which is approximately a foot lower than the doorway shed roof. At the eastern corner, a single-leaf door with six-pane transom and a concrete lintel is accessed by nine concrete steps.

The eastern elevation is fenestrated by a six-over-six, double-hung window near each corner. Two sets of six, nine-over-nine, double-hung windows are placed in between. A raised doorway, which is accessed by six concrete steps, is positioned between the southern six-over-six window and the southernmost set of nine-over-nine windows.

The southern elevation is lighted by three six-over-six, double-hung windows that are asymmetrically arranged in the eastern half of the elevation. The building is still used for classrooms.

#### **Pyatt School Building**

Marion County experienced a zinc and lead mining boom in the 1910's, due in part to the military demands of World War I. Following the war, the mining industry in northern Arkansas underwent a swift decline as prices fell and production costs soared. The population of Marion County dropped quickly as discouraged miners and their families sought work elsewhere. Local farmers who had supplied various goods and services to the mining industry adjusted to the economic dislocations and returned to subsistence farming. The Pyatt School was built in 1925 just as the small community of Pyatt had begun to emerge from these dislocations.<sup>1</sup>

The Pyatt School Building, constructed during the period covered by the historic context *The Evolution of the Public School System in the Arkansas Ozarks, 1920-1940*, is a representative example of a large stone school building constructed for a rural school district. Its use during this period as a local school building clearly identifies it with this historic context and with this property type. It is significant locally under Criterion A through its direct associations with the history of the evolution of the public school system in the Ozark Mountain region of the state during this period.


