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Architecture:

Much of the architectural significance of this house lies in the manner in which the single story Federal style structure was transformed into a Greek Revival I-house by the addition of a second floor and an entry portico on stone piers. The original form and arched door heading are similar to those of a house in Bowling Green (see Wa-B-123). The owner of the house in the late nineteenth century operated his distilling company from the farm.
