DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Florence Coffee House is located at 130 Main Street in downtown Baton Rouge, half a block back from the Mississippi River levee. When it was built the Coffee House was comparatively large, but today it is dwarfed by many of the surrounding buildings.

When the Coffee House was built, it consisted of one large commercial room below, and four taller residential rooms above in a "piano nobile" condition. There was also an unfinished attic and a rear kitchen -servants' wing. Today the lower story has been divided into two rooms with a carriage port entrance under an elliptical arch. The original appearance of the lower story is not known. Before the present owners installed the old style door, window, and arched carriage port, the lower story had a 1920's plate glass shop front. The mantel in the major ground floor room is new to the house, but its design duplicates the mantels upstairs. The only major changes upstairs have been the installation of a small laundry room, the installation of a bathroom, and the replacement in kind of the iron front balcony. The four French doors on the facade were also replaced in kind.

The house is constructed of stuccoed brick bearing walls with gable parapets. The beams which run from side wall to side wall were probably "cannibalized" from earlier structures.

Decorative features include a denticular cornice and a heavy aedicule motif mantels.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Florence Coffee House is a more or less typical example of a mid-19th century in-town commercial-residential structure. This can be seen in its two and a half story gable parapeted form, in its commerical lower story and residential upper story, and in its "piano nobile" articulation of the upper story with graceful French doors and an iron balcony.

Baton Rouge is a city which has been almost completely rebuilt in the 20th century. As a result the Coffee House represents an urban form which has all but vanished. There is in fact only one other substantial example of a house of this type remaining in the city.

The Florence Coffee House was built in 1850 by Johan and Lucas Florence to replace an earlier building which had been destroyed by fire. On July 24, 1850, the Florences signed a contract with Nelson Potts for the building's construction. The cost was \$1,225.

In 1852 the property was sold to Matteo Dorice for \$2,500 and since then there has been a long succession of owners. Until the Civil War the building remained in use as a coffee house. Since the war it has served a variety of uses, being at different times a grocery, a cobbler shop, a boardinghouse, and a private residence. The present owners restored the building in 1971. The architect of the restoration was William R. Brockway and the contractor Peter L. Martin.




