18. Description The Bates House is a one and one-half story rectangular building of brick construction with a one-story brick ell. Fenestration consists of four bays with two off-center entrances. All exterior facade bays are embellished with delicate reeding with corner block. 18. 6/6 pane windows with jackarches pierce the facade. Both entranceways have three-pane transoms which have been enclosed. Interior gable end chimneys with two 2/2/2 pane gable windows at each end arise from the gabled tin roof, and the ell also has an interior gable-end chimney. The dwelling has a full basement of limestone construction. The poplar rafters are 4' X 4', and floor joists are poplar logs. The high quality Federal woodwork is executed in symmetrical trim. Federal style mantels and floor to ceiling four-panel wallpresses are intact. A one and one-half story frame meathouse is the only dependency associated with the dwelling.

20. dwellings included in the Historic Resources of Trimble County, the Bates House, the Bird House and Tm-55 represent the best illustrations of this particular style in Trimble County. The dwelling is historically significant in the early development of the county, and a significant cultural resource. Although in a neglected state today, the Bates House displays excellent craftsmanship and design, and reflects admirable architectural qualities of the Federal style as is evident by the Flemish bond facade, period embellishments of the exterior facade bays and outstanding interior detailing.

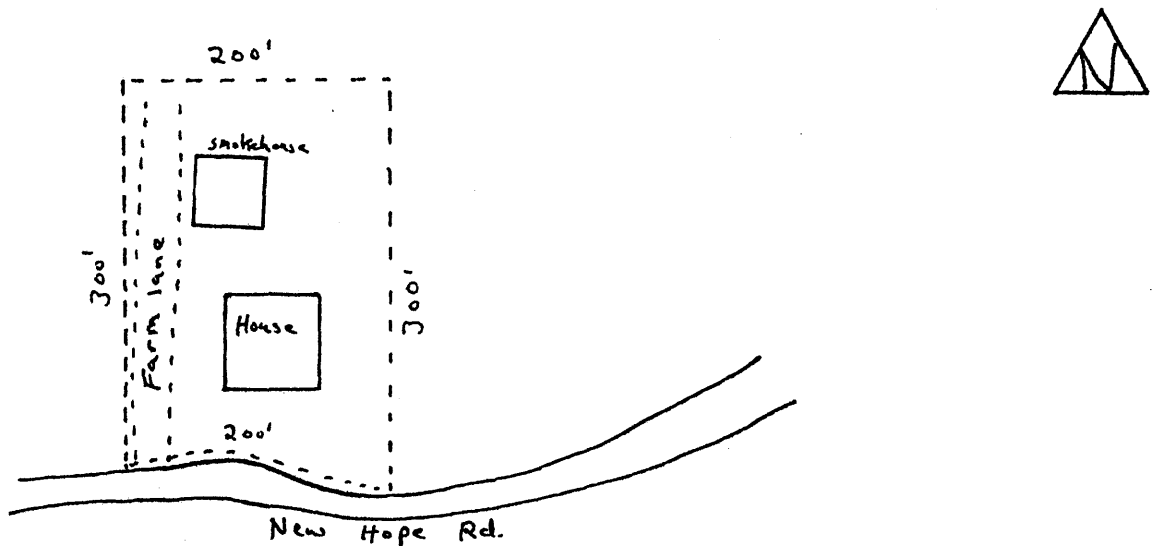

Beginning at the intersection of the farm lane and New Hope Road proceed 300' in a northward direction; thence 200' in an eastward direction; thence 300' in a southward direction; thence 200' in a westward direction to the point of origin. The boundary is drawn to include the house and outbuilding.
