Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Deceriation

The Seavey-Robinson House is located on a residential street consisting mostly of buildings dating from the early 20th century. This area does not possess the potential for an historic district.

The Seavey-Robinson House is a one-and-one- half story wood frame building with clapboard siding and a gable roof with wide over-hanging eaves. The house has six-over-six double-hung sash and a veranda without a roof extending across the principal facade. The exterior is distinguished for its abundance of delicately-scaled decorative woodwork. Over the main entrance, which has pilasters and sidelights, is a shallow gable roof portico with cresting and vergeboard. There are bracketed cornices over the windows and, at the half-story level on the principal facade, distinctive grille-work. This elevation also features curved panelling at each corner and across the top of the wall. Vergeboard cut in an acorn motif extends along the cornice. Finally, the veranda has a balustrade with intricate scroll-work.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Now located in a built-up urban section of South Portland, this charming "Carpenter Gothic" farm cottage is a rare survivor attesting to the city's rural past when this region across the Fore River from Portland was farming country which supplied the needs of those living in the town. Its original owner, Joseph Seavey, was a carpenter in what was then part of Cape Elizabeth. The house he built, with its elaborite decorative woodwork, served as a display of his abilities as a builder and demonstrated his knowledge of the latest picturesque styles.

By 1860, Seavey had moved his practice up the road in what was then called Knight's Village, but which is now the center of South Portland. Elipalet C. Robinson acquired the house in 1864 when the developing transportation facilities put this area in commuting distance to Portland. Robinson worked for C. E. Jose and Company in the city. The Robinson's owned the house well into this century.

The Gothic cottage, particularly in a rural context, is comparatively rare in Maine and it is most unusual to find one still surviving in what is now an urban setting. The ingenious arrangement of decorative detail in the main facade is particularly to be noted.
