

19. History The Yenowine family were among the earliest settlers in the Jeffersontown area. George Bence Yenowine (1814-1889) supposedly built this house on his father Frederick's land. George B. married Elizabeth Seabolt in 1844 and the house probably dates from that time. George and Elizabeth had seven children, two of whom, Hattie and Alice, lived out their (SEE NEXT PAGE)			34. In 1894 Poet Eugene Field stayed at the Yenowine home. He became acquainted with the family through George H. Yenowine who was editor of the Yenowine News in Milwaukee and later Sunday editor of the Louisville Courier Journal. Field wrote three poems during his visit there and kept up a correspondence with the Yenowine sisters during the following years.
