NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA STATEMENT (if applicable)

The expansion of the Farlow & Kenrick Parks National Register Historic District to include a section of Park Avenue is justified by the results of additional research carried out after the initial designation of the District in 1982. At that time the village's survey of pre-1907 buildings was incomplete. The Newton Corner survey was completed in 1983, leading to the recognition of a cluster of significant, but previously unsurveyed buildings on Park Street at the southern tip of Kenrick Park. This cluster is contiguous with the existing Farlow & Kenrick Parks N.R.H.D. and should be considered an extension thereof. Park Street is lined with residences possessing integrity of location, design, setting materials and workmanship.

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other areas within the community.

The architectural variety and quality present in the Farlow & Kenrick Parks N.R.H.D. are also evident along Park Street. Almost every major nineteenth century style is represented, including Greek Revival, Gothic Revival, Queen Anne and Colonial Revival domestic buildings. These styles illustrate the development of residential architecture and the development of the area's growth.

The fashionable residences along Park Street are representative of the variety and quality of the houses in the original Farlow & Kenrick Parks N.R.H.D. The earliest of the houses in the expansion area is the house at 237 Park Street (1830), a full-porticoed temple front Greek Revival house. The front-facing gable of the house projects beyond the main block to form a deep porch supported by four monumental Doric columns. The verticality of the columns is modified by a full-width balcony with robustly turned

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain historical importance of area and how the area relates to the development of other areas of the community.

Suburban development in Newton began in earnest after the mid-nineteenth century when Newton's transportation system introduced streetcar lines. Rapid suburbanization centered around commuter depots like Newton Corner. The Farlow & Kenrick Parks N.R.H.D. was densely built up during the years between 1870 and 1910, a fact which is evidenced by the variety of architectural styles present.

The Farlow & Kenrick Parks N.R.H.D. is an excellent example of an upper-middle class, late nineteenth century residential neighborhood. With its outstanding residential buildings and two small parks designed by the noted landscape architect Alexander Wadsworth, the neighborhood remains one of the best such examples in Newton as well as the Boston area.

Park Street was laid out on land which had been part of a large estate owned by George Lord. Lord, who died in 1893, had amassed a fortune in shipping, real estate, insurance and as a director of the Boston & Maine Railroad. The area bounded by Park, Franklin, Waverley and Sargent Streets was the former land comprising the Lord estate. By 1874 only two houses had been built along Park Street. By 1886 Lord sold some land along Sargent Street, but little development occurred until after his death. At that time, his estate was sold and numerous large suburban houses began to be built on the resulting ample house lots.

Architectural Significance:

balusters. The massiveness of the forms and the solidity of the house represent Greek Revival design at its finest.

The house at 226 Park Street (1865) is a very late example of a typical pattern book Gothic house. Built on a cross-gable scheme the house follows an asymmetrical plan and is distinguished by a small Gothic dormer and gable windows, and by the porch with open struts. The house is flush-boarded in an attempt to simulate ashlar masonry.

The house at 243 Park Street is an elaborate example of the suburban domestic Queen Anne style. Built circa 1882, it features a variety of building materials. The first story is of red dressed sandstone, while the upper stories are articulated in cut and patterned wood shingles. A wrap-around veranda with shingled posts turned balusters and a spindle frieze is offset to the right. A polygonal facade bay rests on a sandstone base and is capped by an ogival roof. A panelled brick chimney and elaborate entrance with beveled glass detailing add to the complexity of the design.

The house at 248 Park Street (1896) is a Georgian Revival design which embodies the characteristic formality of the style. In quality of workmanship and range of fine materials it illustrates the high point reached by American building before World War I. The use of red brick for this house is unusual in Newton before 1900. The boxy form is capped by a gable roof punctuated by elliptical dormers. The focal point of the three-bay facade is the broad elliptical entrance porch with Doric columns.

The block of Park Street running south from the lower end of Kenrick Park is uniformly residential in character. Despite a diversity of architectural styles, the scale and setback are uniform. No voids or intrusions disrupt the integrity of the expansion of the district.

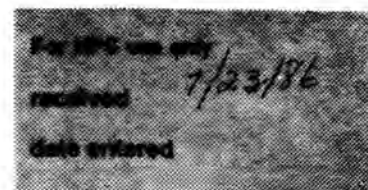
