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Description The Confederate Monument in Mount Sterling is located in the Machpelah Cemetery. It is carved of white marble and reaches approximately 15 feet tall, including the two tiered limestone base, which is approximately two feet high. Three verses of the poem "Bivouac of the Dead" are inscribed on the east side of the monument. The monument is made of five distinct pieces. It is topped with a star that straddles a ball. This star and ball design rests atop of a gable-topped section which in turn sits on the top of a section that has Gothic arches on four faces with the inscription on the west side. These sections rest upon a capped square base that sits on top of two cut limestone rectangles that form the base of the monument.

Statement of Significance The Mount Sterling Confederate Monument meets National Register Criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This monument was erected in 1880. It is a good example of the early efforts around the state of Kentucky to commemorate the efforts of Kentucky's Confederate troops in the Civil War. This monument was erected in a cemetery and this follows the pattern of the early monuments to memorialize the "Lost Cause," the failed cause of the Confederacy. It is an example of the property type "other."

Verbal Boundary Description -The Mount Sterling Confederate Monument boundaries form a circle with a radius of ten feet centered on the monument located in Machpelah Cemetery in Mount Sterling, Montgomery County, Kentucky.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.
