

DESCRIPTION: (cont.) external brick stepped shouldered chimney to E.; internal chimney in frame section; stone external slope shouldered chimney to N. of frame; brackets under eaves; louvered openings for cellar. INTERIOR: open string spiral stair w/decorative brackets and walnut newel post similar to Simmstown; pronounced architrave; windows go to floor in E. rm.; pic. rails; mantel has 5 panel frieze w/double fluted pilasters 3/4 round as in Grundy home(WS-7)-paneled pilasters on mantel in N. rm. on ell; simple mantels in upstairs rms.

The frame section has a faced limestone foundation, and bricks fill the interspaces between the studdings. Brick herringbone walks go to the front porch and are found in other sections around the house. To the W. of the frame are the remains of a limestone foundation.

SIGNIFICANCE: (cont.) construction with its brick interspacing between the studs suggesting a half-timbered bldg. suggests an interesting architectural history.

HISTORY: (cont.) acquired the land from the heirs of Gabriel Kendrick in 1882. The house is presently associated with John A. Tucker, J. W. Tucker, and P. S. Barber.

While the house is presently T-form with Italianate characteristics, close observation of the brickwork seems to indicate an early construction date with the first floor brick, an alteration later to a second story brick, then the frame addition. The rear windows, 2nd floor, of the brick are segmental arched as opposed to the flat arch of the first floor.

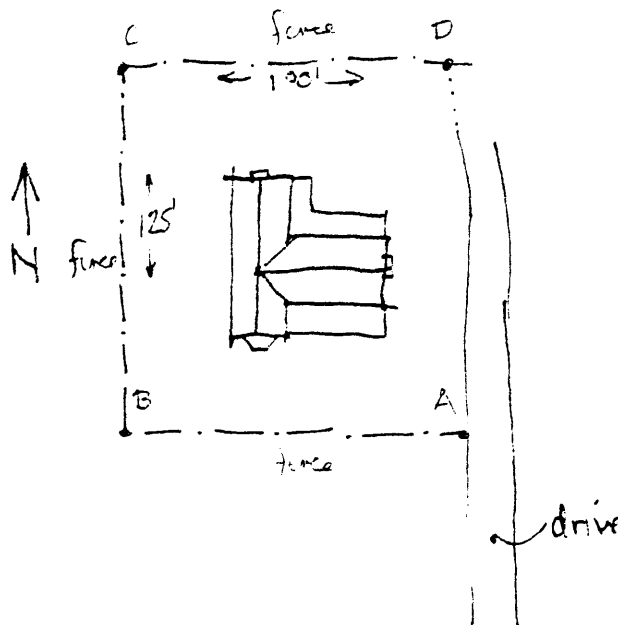

Verbal Boundary Description Acreage 0.3 acre

Point A is 35 feet southeast of the southeast corner of the house. Beginning at Point A, proceeding west 100 feet along a fence to Point B, thence north 125 feet along a fence to Point C, thence 100 feet east along a fence to Point D, thence south along a drive 125 feet to the point of origin. The boundaries were drawn to include the house and domestic-related space as enclosed by fences and drive. There are no outbuildings. The nomination area contains one contributing building.
