DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Known as "The Double Gateway to the Rockies," the town of Lyons lies within the valley of the St. Vrain Creek in Boulder County, Colorado. This stream is fed from two canyons to the west, the North and South St. Vrain, allowing dual access into the mountains. The town is bordered to the north by active and abandoned quarries which provided the district with the unique Lyons sandstone.

Within this valley is the Lyons Historic District, a non-contiguous collection of sandstone buildings. Of the fifteen structures comprising the district, eleven are situated within the city limits; the remaining four are scattered around the boundaries. These structures, commercial, public, and residential, vary from a one room storage building to a two-story school house. They were all constructed between the early 1870s and 1917. All buildings are composed of rock faced, coursed, Lyons sandstone, reflecting the skill of local craftsmen in utilizing this native building material.

Lyons Historic District:

- 1. Evans Homestead (Northwest of Lyons): early 1870s, Lyons sandstone, two story house, one story blacksmith shop.
- 2. Chisholm House (425 Seward): early 1890s, Lyons sandstone, one story.
- 3. Residence (413 Seward): early 1890s, Lyons sandstone, one story.
- 4. Residence (409 Seward): early 1890s, Lyons sandstone, one story.
- 5. Lyons General Store (426 High): 1884, Lyons sandstone, one story.
- 6. Old Stone Church (High): 1894, Lyons sandstone, one story, single steeple flush with facade, presently on the National Register, restoration work planned.
- 7. Lyons School (High): 1881, first story Lyons sandstone, second story metal sheets molded to resemble stone (1900), restoration work now in progress.
- 8. Dynamite Storage Building (High): 1890s, Lyons sandstone, one story shed.
- 9. McAllister Saloon (Main): 1881, Lyons sandstone, one story, flat roof.
- General Store (415 Main): 1890s, Lyons sandstone, two stories, flat roof, partially restored.
- 11. Turner-Stevens Building (401 Main): 1917, bank and garage, Lyons sandstone, one story, decorative cornice, flat roof, partially restored.
- 12. Lyons Train Depot (railroad tracks): 1885, Lyons sandstone, one story, restored, now houses the municipal library, presently on the National Register.
- 13. Homestead Building (South of Lyons): 1870s, Lyons sandstone, two stories.

TATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Lyons Historic District is significant for the role it played in the settlement of Boulder County and for the role the buildings played in the local sandstone industry and in local commerce. From an architectural perspective the District is significant for the sandstone buildings which represent a type, period, and method of construction that is relatively unique.

In 1880, E. S. Lyon, having left Connecticut for reasons of health, bought 160 acres of land at the present site of Lyons. An energetic promoter, he realized the value of the sandstone deposits on his property and the next year formed the Evans Townsite Company and the Lyon Rock and Lime Quarry Company. Soon the hills were active with stoneworkers who produced the unique, reddish colored sandstone which was hauled by wagons seventeen miles east to be shipped by rail to Denver. In 1884 the track was extended to Lyons to facilitate the shipment of stone. The production of sandstone brought an economic boom to the area, and these years witnessed the construction of educational, religious, commercial, and residential structures, the survivors of which make up the District. Lyons continued to prosper until the early twentieth century when cement began to replace the sandstone in construction, and the demise of the industry began. Yet Lyons remained as a popular tourist spot near Rocky Mountain National Park and as a railhead for small shipments of gold ore.

It is the color and quality that makes Lyons sandstone a unique building material. It was used in many structures in Colorado, perhaps most notably for buildings on the University of Colorado campus in Boulder. Yet the sandstone was also used for sidewalks and curbs, and during its peak era, it was shipped as far east as Chicago and New York to be used in the construction of brownstone buildings, often to form decorative lintels. Some nearby quarries are still in use as there is a demand for the sandstone for use in the construction of fireplaces and patios.

From an architectural perspective the structures in the District are vernacular in style, but the reddish hue of the sandstone makes them stand out visually as a distinctive element in the community. Rectangular in shape, one or two stories in height, these buildings have relatively few decorative elements, thus reflecting Lyons' origins and development as a quarry town, but the structures do impart a sense of the past as they illustrate the adaptation of a local building material to the needs of the community.

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

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


