Summary

Originally constructed in 1900, the First Baptist Church located on Arkansas Highway 159 south of Eudora, Chicot County was rebuilt in 1946. It is a white-painted, wood-frame building resting upon a combination of brick and concrete piers and covered by a composition-shingled, cross-gable roof that features a short gable-roof bell tower. A mixture of weatherboard and novelty siding is used over the walls. There is a solitary interior brick chimney positioned near the southwest corner of the building. The interior has been modernized by the installation of carpet, wood paneling, and an acoustical-tile ceiling, but still retains historic wainscoting, doors and moldings, and other details.

Describe present and historic physical appearance:

Elaboration

The First Baptist Church is a white-painted, wood-frame building resting upon a combination of brick and concrete piers and covered by a composition-shingled, cross-gable roof that features a short gable-roof bell tower. All of the eaves contain exposed rafter tails. A mixture of weatherboard and novelty siding is used over the walls. There is a solitary interior brick chimney positioned near the southwest corner of the building.

The front, or northern, elevation features the entrance vestibule with an end gable roof below that of the main section of the church. This elevation is symmetrically composed of modern double-leaf doors in the center, which are accessed by concrete steps, flanked by two small three-over-one wood windows.

A concrete cornerstone is located at the eastern corner of the vestibule. It reads:

A rectangular louvered wood vent is present on the bell tower immediately above the gable-roof ridge of the vestibule. The northern elevations of the cross-gables to either side of the main section each contain single-leaf entries.

The western elevation consists of a three-over-one wood window in the vestibule, a one-over-one wood window in the main section, two one-over-one windows in the cross-gable end section, and a single-leaf entrance into the hipped-roof section that extends across the rear of the church. The eastern elevation is identically composed.

The rear, or southern, elevation is fenestrated by a one-over-one wood window to the west, a group of three one-over-one windows in the center, and a one-over-one window to the east.

The interior has been modernized by the installation of carpet, wood paneling, and an acoustical-tile ceiling, but still retains historic wainscoting, doors and moldings, and other details.

Summary

Architect/Builder:____

The First Baptist Church in Eudora is being nominated under Criterion A with local significance as an amendment to the Historic and Architectural Resources Associated with the Ethnic and Racial Minority Settlement of the Arkansas Delta multiple property nomination. The First Baptist Church is significant for its association with the African-American congregation on this site from the period of 1900 to 1947 and thus meets the requirements of the historic context, "Minority Settlement in the Mississippi River Counties of the Arkansas Delta, 1870 - 1930."

Elaboration

The town of Eudora lies in Chicot County in southeastern Arkansas. Its eastern boundary is determined by the Mississippi River which is thought to have been the source of three lakes in the county, Mason Lake, Grand Lake and Lake Chicot or Old River Lake. Early settlers formed small villages on riverside holdings. Little is known about the early history of the First Baptist Church in Eudora. This African-American congregation is believed to have been organized as early as 1860. The first church was named Mt. Carmel and was located near Spikeman Hill and the Mason Cemetery of Eudora. The second church was located on the site of the current church on land donated by Joe White.

The first officers were J. P. White, senior deacon, George Mykes, George Pride, John C____, Jim Rindles, Ben Campbell, T. J. Pride, John Drone, and Will White. The first pastor was Reverend N. E. Edwards followed by the Reverends R. H. Keith, G. W. Owens, W. M. Mitchell, Edward E. Davis, R. L. Littleton, D. C. C____, and G. K. Littleton. The current pastor is Reverend H. P. Donaldson.

The First Baptist Church is being nominated under Criterion A with local significance as an amendment to the Historic and Architectural Resources Associated with the Ethnic and Racial Minority Settlement of the Arkansas Delta multiple property nomination. Though the church was rebuilt following damage from a storm in 1946, it still retains the essential integrity needed for it to be nominated under the historic context "Minority Settlement in the Mississippi River Counties of the Arkansas Delta, 1870 - 1930."




