HISTORY: (cont.) to the mill and property, but in June, 1889 he sold one-half of the business to F. M. Campbell and the mills became known as Jarboe and Campbell's Mill. By 1915 the firm is known as the Springfield Roller Mills and is owned by C. R. McWhorter and H. L. Wells. A 1918 deed to G. L. Haydon shows the bldg. used in part as a tobacco warehouse. By July 1920, G. L. Haydon was sole owner of Springfield Roller Mills and he began renovating and adding to the mill. In 1927, Haydon Mill and Grain Co., Inc. became the owner and retained ownership until 1977, when Haydon & Montgomery, Inc. purchased. The business is presently known as Montgomery & Smith.


