

18. Description This two story, commercial structure with one story wings is constructed of brick in English garden wall bond. Long and narrow, it is situated with one end facing the street. All the entries and windows in both stories, all with brick relieving arches, have been altered considerably from the original; the window on the far right was an entry originally. 19. History Built in 1912 as a tobacco warehouse, the building had a storage capacity of 3000 hogsheads and cost \$150,000. The present owner has been located here since 1927. It was built on the former site of the A.V. Dupont Paper Mill.		33. Tape No. _____ Negative No. _____	
20. Significance The building is situated in what was the heart of Louisville's tobacco district. It was designed by C.A. Curtin, a prominent local architect.
