

18. Description Two-story, five-bay brick house with a brick cornice and jack arches above the windows. The doorway has narrow sidelights and a six-pane transom. A two-story ell is at the rear. It has an enclosed corner staircase in what is now the dining room, which gives access to the room above. There are paneled door reveals and panels (SEE NEXT PAGE)																													
19. History The house is thought to have been built by Moses Tyler, who may have first built the stone house on the site. Moses Tyler was a son of Edward Tyler who came to Jefferson County from Virginia about 1780. Oral tradition states that Edward and his sons Moses and William were here by 1773. Moses had a 220 acre land grant in 1792 and in 1794 purchased 200 acres from (SEE NEXT PAGE)																													
20. Significance The Moses Tyler House is a fine example of an early nineteenth century Federal farmhouse. A significant number of original outbuildings remain to make the complex one of the best preserved groups of farm buildings in Jefferson County.

beneath the windows. Also on the site is a one-story stone house with exterior chimneys that probably pre-dates the brick house. There is also a log barn and a stone spring-house.

his brother William Tyler. Another brother, Edward Tyler, Jr. lived at Rock Dale (JF-260) and the original Tyler homestead may have been what is now known as the Old Wilderness Fort (JF-259). In 1834 Moses Tyler deeded his land and house in trust to his son Presly Tyler who was, according to the trust, to provide his father with a home until his death. Moses died in 1839 and is buried in the graveyard that is on the farm now adjoining Rock Dale. Presly Tyler lived on the farm until his death in 1881. It passed through several owners. In 1950 the land was acquired by Judge MaCauley Smith. The Smiths restored the house and have carefully maintained the outbuildings. In March, 1979 the Smiths donated the farm and buildings to the Commonwealth of Kentucky for use as a public nature preserve.

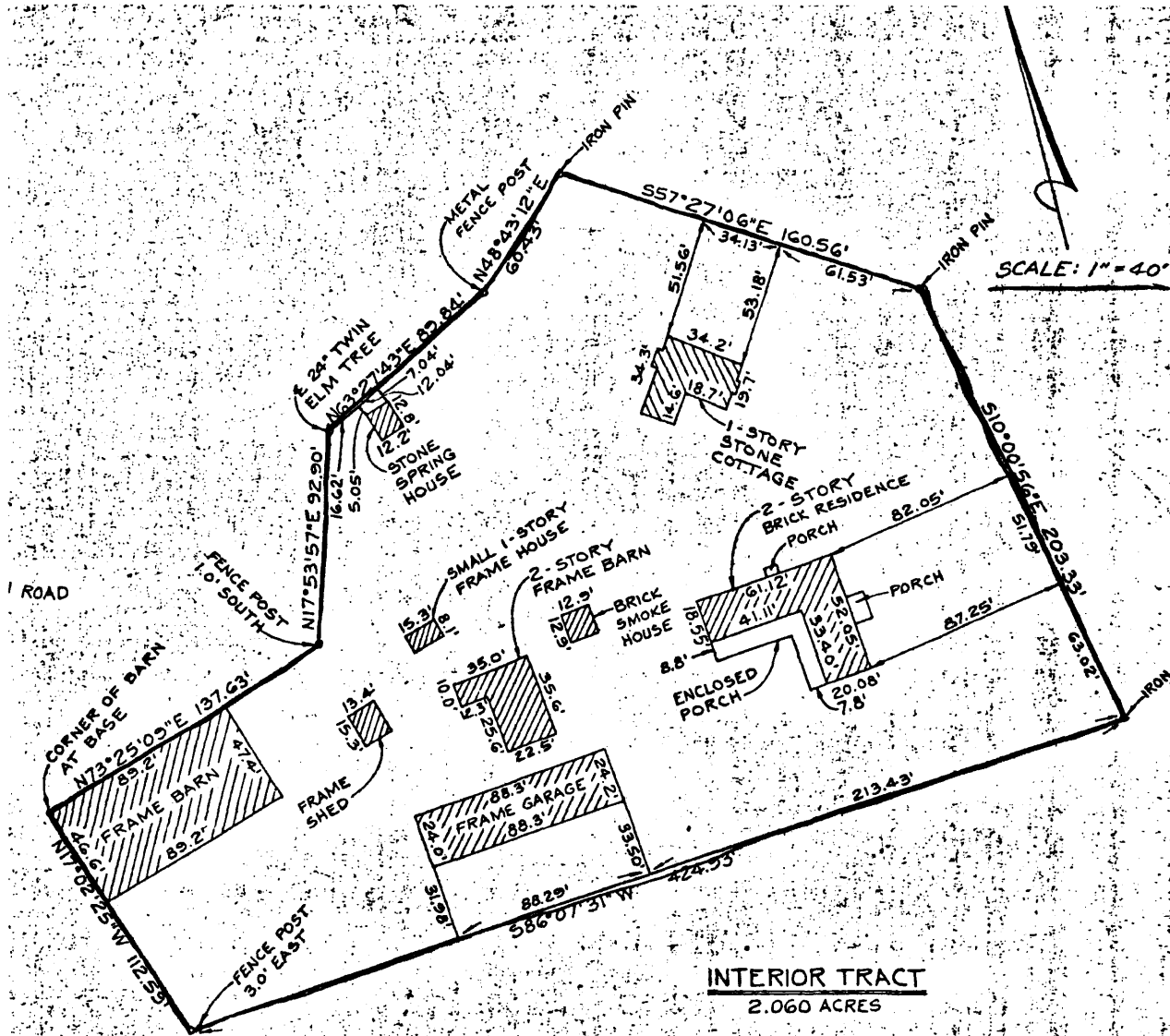

The boundary of the Blackacre nomination is shown as a red line on the attached survey. (SCALE: 40 feet to one inch.)

The frame garage is an open, shed-type structure of recent construction. It is sheathed in weathered clapboards and is compatible in appearance with the older frame outbuildings.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Since the original submission of this nomination, further research has revealed that the brick house was built in 1844-45 for Presly Tyler, Moses Tyler's son. A recently-discovered collection of Tyler family papers included bills and receipts for making and laying bricks for Presly Tyler's dwelling house.
